

FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT

17TH MARCH 2024

Gospel: John 11: 1-45

I am the resurrection and the life.

What was going through Lazarus' mind as he lay seriously ill? Perhaps he was hoping that his friend Jesus would turn up and heal him. Certainly, his healing was the assumption of his sisters. Although Jesus knew that Lazarus was dying, he did not rush to Bethany, but stayed two more days where he was, and then turned up after Lazarus' death. Like the sisters, we pray for those seriously ill that they would recover. Like the sisters, our hopes are often dashed. Why



did Jesus allow his friend to die? Today's gospel reminds us that God's timing is not ours. Though our prayers often do not correspond in the time and way that we would like, prayers from the heart always have an answer. Jesus has his own time and way of acting on behalf of those whom he loves. God will reveal his glory in all who die in Christ, as in the death of Lazarus. We can look forward to our own resurrection, as Lazarus himself now does. Note that Lazarus still needs to be resurrected, as his raising is not strictly speaking a resurrection. Lazarus would have to die again, just as Jairus' daughter and the son of the widow of Nain had to die again. These, Jesus also raised from the dead. Of the three, the raising of Lazarus is the greatest miracle, since Lazarus had been dead for four days, not just one, or for a few hours. We do not know whether Jairus' daughter and the son of the widow of Nain became, like Lazarus, members of the embryonic Church. They certainly had their own good news to share. Yet Lazarus had more, sharing not just his own miraculous raising, but as all the disciples of Jesus were shortly to discover, the unique resurrection of his Saviour. The knowledge of his Saviour's resurrection, can only have strengthened him for that day when he had to face death a second time. He would have welcomed death as one who had been through it before, but more to the point, he would die knowing that he would soon see his friend again and be in his presence forever. If we have befriended Jesus in this life, acknowledged his saving power over death and sin, and made our peace with God and our fellow men, then with confidence in God we can look death in the face. Jesus says today, 'I am the resurrection and the life. If anyone believes in me, even though he dies he will live, and whoever lives and believes in me will never die'. Believing in Him, whatever the circumstances of our death, and indeed life, we can know Jesus as friend not judge. This friendship means access into eternal life now, though, not yet the fullness but the foretaste of what is to come. Of course, we have the advantage of foresight and knowledge which wasn't available to Lazarus' sisters as they saw their brother die. Before the miracle, they were grief stricken and questioned their faith. Martha's words, like those so often of the psalmist, are plaintive if not complaintive, 'Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died'. Do we not hear these words in those who ask where was God when they most needed him? Yet in spite of her questioning, Martha elicits one of the greatest statements of faith in the New Testament, 'but I know that, even now, whatever you ask of God, he will grant you'. It is Martha on this occasion who seems to have the better part. Mary, on the other hand, though replicating Martha's words, 'Lord if you had been here, my brother would not have died' is over whelmed by inconsolable grief. Jesus wept. Jesus met them, as he meets us, exactly where we are. He asks us, as he asked Martha, do we believe? The sisters had their own tombs to leave and grave clothes to put off, as do we. Jesus spoke words of life and hope for the sake of those standing around him. Our catechumens will shortly do the same, speaking for the sake of those who have not heard his message of life... the only message, quite frankly, that can bring life and peace to this troubled world.
