

# PALM SUNDAY

# 24<sup>TH</sup> MARCH 2024

Gospel: The Passion according to St Mark.

It might be useful to explain what is going to happen over the next few days in the life of our church, as I frequently encounter even catholics who haven't the faintest idea. Today on Palm Sunday we are entering upon the most holy week in the Church's annual calendar, the events leading up to the Death and Resurrection of our Lord. We mark the start of Holy Week by remembering Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem, after which we will hear the passion narrative from one of the Synoptic gospels (this year Mark). This passion narrative covers the events of the last three days of Jesus' mortal life, Maundy



Thursday, Good Friday and the Easter Vigil. These three days are given a special name, the Triduum, meaning the three days. On each of the days we relive the unfolding events of Jesus' betrayal, death and resurrection. On Maundy Thursday we mark Jesus' last supper with his friends, during which he left us the eucharist and washed his disciples' feet, and then went out to the Mount of Olives. Here he entered into the deep prayer, known as the agony in Gethsemane, where he wrestled with his divine calling to lay down his life. Jesus' journey out from the upper room to Gethsemane is marked by the procession after mass to a specially prepared garden, where we will hold our own vigil before the Lord. Then on the following day, on Good Friday we will gather to hear the passion narrative from John's gospel, which relates Jesus' betraval by Judas, the desertion of the disciples, our Lord's trials before Herod and Pilate, his condemnation, his journey to the cross and his crucifixion. Then we have the veneration of the cross, acknowledging Jesus's sacrificial death upon the cross for our pride and rebellion. Good Friday is the only day when there is no mass anywhere in the world, though we can receive communion from the reserved sacrament to remind us that it is only through his saving death that we are his family. On the following evening of Holy Saturday, we hold the vigil of Easter, in which we will welcome the first light of resurrection (symbolically represented by the lighting of the fire and the Easter candle) and be reminded of God's faithfulness throughout history. The mass follows, with the sacraments of baptism and confirmation, during which our catechumens and candidates who have been preparing over the last year will enter into the full communion of the Church. The Easter vigil is the first mass of Easter, but not everyone will attend, some preferring to attend one of the Sunday morning masses. The church lays down that as a bare minimum, every Catholic should receive communion at least once a year. To receive holy communion, one should examine one's conscience, and if there is any sin which hasn't been confessed, especially mortal sin, then this should be done before receiving communion. The Church recommends that at least once in the year (and recommends Easter as a suitable time) every Catholic should confess. On Monday morning and evening, therefore, we will offer a parish penitential service, where several priests will hear confessions. The obligation to receive the communion and confession at least once a year seems incredibly light, but remember it is seen as the bare minimum of our observance. However, if Catholic, we are expected to attend mass every Sunday (or Saturday evening, the Saturday evening being recognised as a Sunday mass) as well as on the few days of obligation, but that is hardly onerous considering how few weeks there are in the year. It goes without saying that Jesus expects all believers to cultivate a Christian lifestyle, loving God above all else and working out that love in treating others like ourselves. Through his love, Jesus invites us to a free assent. We are under no compulsion to honour Him, but please remember that through His passion He has opened for us the way to salvation, a joy filled wholeness now, whatever befall us, and life in the world to come. Many choose to reject Him, go their own way and turn aside. Will we? Will we be like Judas who betrayed him, Peter who denied him, the disciples who deserted him and the crowd who hungered for his death. From the cross he forgave them. He forgives us also. God is love and doesn't condemn us. We condemn ourselves by putting ourselves first. Fr Julian
