

THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT

3RD MARCH 2024

Gospel: *John 2: 13-25*

Destroy this sanctuary, and in three days I will raise it up.

The Temple at Jerusalem was the designated place for the major feasts of Israel and pre-eminently where the chosen people entered into God's presence. The Temple however was not exclusively for the Jews. This is why in Mark's account of the cleansing of the Temple, Jesus proclaimed that 'my house shall be a house of prayer for all nations'. One of the largest courts in the Temple was called the Court of the Gentiles where all non-Jews were allowed to pray. A boundary notice warned the Gentiles on pain of death from proceeding any further into the Temple complex. It would have been in this court that the cleansing of the Temple (today's gospel) took place. Instead of allowing non-Jews space to pray, the Temple authorities had set up a market place for the transaction of goods. Cattle, sheep and pigeons for Temple sacrifices were sold in the only place accessible for the nations. As they were forbidden to proceed beyond this court, encroachment upon it was a real infringement of gentile privilege. There were other reasons however for Jesus' reaction. Those who purchased animals sold in the Temple could do so only in Temple currency, which had to be obtained through official moneychangers. We know from elsewhere that the Temple authorities were



charging an extortionate rate of exchange, which benefited their own pocket. This explains why in Mark's gospel, Jesus accuses the authorities of making God's house into 'a den of thieves'. When Jesus was asked to justify why he had acted so violently against the money-changers and the sellers of the animals, he implied that his own body was a greater Temple and that the visible Temple at Jerusalem was only provisional. Later in John's gospel, Jesus would tell the Samaritan woman, that before long true worshippers would worship not exclusively in Jerusalem. He was prophesying of His Church. After Pentecost, not only would his followers become a temple of the Holy Spirit, they would also assemble together in different places, throughout the known world, rather than just in Jerusalem. Safety determined where they could meet. Private houses recommended themselves. However before long the size of gathering forced the early Christians to worship in designated places, distinguishable from their homes. Otherwise why would St Paul need to remind the early Church that what they should be doing here should differ from what they did in their houses? We can see how such areas soon became 'holy', set part from activities done in the home, which would eventually give rise to buildings consecrated for communal worship, differing from the worship offered in daily life. Our cathedrals, basilicas and churches, mostly built by the catholic faithful, and saturated with prayer and even martyrs' blood, are holy places and should not be used for profane uses. Whatever the pull of disco-dancing, to paraphrase St Paul, do you not have disco halls for these? Gimmicks will not bring life to our churches, only the gospel of Christ crucified and raised from the dead. The power of consecration is tangible where the Word is proclaimed, the sacraments celebrated, and the people of God animated by the Holy Spirit. May we offer the temples of our own bodies for consecration as well, not least in this time of lent. Let us offer ourselves for some divine cleansing. Are there any heavy tables that Jesus needs to overturn in our lives? Are we robbing God and others? It's time for a spiritual spring-clean.
