

EASTER SUNDAY

31ST MARCH 2024

Gospel: John 20: 1-9 He must rise from the dead.

Alleluia Christ is risen. He has risen indeed! Christ is alive and love has triumphed. His shameful cross has become the door to life. Jesus' whole mission of loving service and sacrifice finds its fulfilment in the Resurrection. God is love, and in love He raises the Son that he loves. His perfect love drives out fear. Fear of death and of the unknown is totally dispelled. The events of the past three days...Jesus' betrayal, condemnation, crucifixion and resurrection... are the working out of his divine love. To show the extent of his love, in donning the garb of a humble servant and stooping to wash the feet of his disciples, Jesus revealed the nature of true servanthood. On the same evening he gave us a new commandment, that we should love, not just one another as ourselves, but as he has loved us. This self-less agape love, so unknown to the world, finds its' greatest expression in his

crucifixion and resurrection. Washing the disciples' feet was the prelude to the greatest act of love, laying down his life for us on the cross. He paid the price for all humanity's woes. The cross alone brings sense to this chaotic world, and our endless search for meaning and purpose. Thereafter, love would be redefined. The song may be largely unknown, but it is still my Saviour's love to me, love to the loveless shown that they might lovely be. We are loveless and become lovely only through the infinite love of the Risen Lord. Jesus shows His love to us in many ways, but pre-eminently through his living presence. His resurrection feast transforms us into the Easter community enabled to share his resurrection life with others, and models a society of love against which all other societies are deficient. We have participation in his risen sacrificial love in other ways as well, for we are infinitely loved. And this was God's intention from eternity, to love us utterly through His Son. 'God so loved the world that he gave his only begotten Son that whosoever believeth in him should not perish but have eternal life'. His empty cross stands as a sentinel against the mangled landscape of human pride and hatreds, calling us to renounce, reject, repent of everything that prevents us from responding to the overtures of divine love. That love, we can never buy or earn. To it, I can only assent. But when I do, when I trust in Jesus Christ, when I confess that he gave his life for me and rose from the dead for me, then nothing can hold back the sluice gates of divine love. Bursting from our self-made tombs and casting away the grave clothes with which we so often bind ourselves, we experience the eternal springtime of our hearts and lives. God calls us, his Church to become the very embodiment of his resurrection life. Jesus, the Resurrection and the Life, is looking to be lodged in the depths of dying and life-less hearts. If we live in him, he will live in us. Death has no hold over the author of life, nor can it over those who live in Him. Through our baptism into his death, we are raised to new life. In the name of the Father, Son and Spirit, we become his new creation. The old has passed and the new has come. Nothing henceforth can separate us from his love. Now we know that we can face the battles of life, because death, evil and sin do not have the last word. In Him we are always victorious. As our collect for Easter Day prays, 'O God who on this day, through your Only Begotten Son, have conquered death and unlocked for us the path to eternity, grant, we pray, that we...may, through the renewal brought by your Spirit, rise up in the light of life'. Christ is risen. He is risen indeed. Alleluia! Fr Julian


