

Gospel: John 10: 11-18

The good shepherd is one who lays down his life for his sheep.

I grew up on a hill farm in Mid-Wales. Conversations often revolved around sheep and those who looked after them. I remember seeing and hearing cases of good shepherding and bad shepherding. Fortunately, my recollections of good shepherding outweigh the bad. Jesus today defines the good shepherd as one who lays down his life for the sheep. He is speaking of himself but the reason why he picked the example of shepherding, is that it helps to illuminate what he meant. The best shepherd cares not just for his own flock, but is concerned generally for sheep and other shepherds. The good shepherd will look out for those sheep who have wandered from his neighbour's flock and return them to him. He will also be concerned for each sheep and lamb, and not just for any financial incentives which they might bring. As in first century Israel, so today, a good shepherd requires certain qualities. A caring heart for the young and the mother ewes goes without saying, and this means being adept at the birthing process. Caring for them involves keeping them healthy, by inoculating them, shearing them, cleaning their feet and eyes and dipping them at the right time. Feeding the flock is vital, sometimes with supplements to pasture, such as animal feed, hay or roots. On occasions, they will need to be relocated to new pasture, so that they have a



balanced diet of good grass, and with easy access to sufficient water. Crucially, the shepherd needs a resilience of spirit and a willingness for hard work in the face of sometimes extremely adverse weather conditions and difficult hours. Particularly busy is the lambing season when sleep has to be sacrificed. Like the shepherds in the Bethlehem fields, the modern shepherd has to keep watch over the flock even by night. Keeping watch is being vigilant in the defence and protection of the flock. The shepherd held his rod and staff for a purpose, not least to drive away wolves. Stray dogs rather than wolves are our problem. These may chase and so exhaust the pregnant sheep that they abort. Etched into my memory is a trailer taking away thirty dead sheep from my grandfather's farm, after a neighbouring sheep dog, whose owner had allowed it to roam freely, rounded them up, forced them into a corner and smothered them to death. Apart from dogs, carrion crows can be threatening, swooping in on an unsuspecting lamb. Eyes are especially vulnerable. Sometimes sheep will wander into danger, such as into thickets or high water. The shepherd's staff or crook with its bent head is ideally shaped to catch the sheep's neck and bring it back to safety. Essential to shepherding is the need to be open to learn and change, to adapt to whatever circumstances present themselves, for one never knows the difficulties that the flock encounter. Finally, and above all, it is vital to get to know one's flock which means observing them well. Jesus says of his spiritual flock, 'I know my own and my own know me'. Today is Good Shepherd Sunday when the Church draws out the shepherd like qualities needed for priesthood, and asks us to encourage the vocation and formation of new priests. In bringing to birth, nurture, caring, protecting, being present and vigilant we can see something of what Jesus meant when he called Peter and the apostles, and those they laid hands on, to be shepherds of the spiritual flock. It is an awesome responsibility and a wonderful calling to become a shepherd in the family of God. No one takes it upon themselves. At the heart of authentic priesthood, as of shepherding, is diaconal service. To become a priest, you first have to become a deacon. The good shepherd is one who serves. This is why the most pastoral of Pope Francis' titles is Servant of the Servants of God. Christian priesthood is not for the squeamish. Like Christian life, it can be messy. Mind where you tread, get used to the smells, enjoy fresh air and don't feel afraid of the dirt or the dark. Fr Julian


HOUSEBOUND & SICK PARISHIONERS
