

FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

Gospel: *John 15: 1-8*

Whoever remains in me, with me in him, bears fruit in plenty.

Jesus today describes himself as the true vine and ourselves as its branches. It is a picture of our communion in him and with each other, 'make your home in me, as I make mine in you...whoever remains in me, with me in him, bears fruit in plenty'. A vine produces grapes for wine, so Jesus' vine produces fruit for the new wine of the kingdom. Our purpose is eucharistic, to give thanks and bring glory to our Heavenly Father. The vine is indistinguishable from its branches, so we are its very body, just as we are the metaphorical body of Christ. Through our incorporation into him, through the sacraments, especially in the communion of the mass, we become, as St Augustine said, more of what we already are. The spiritual



vine is dressed by the Father. The Father cuts away every branch that bears no fruit and prunes other branches to make them more fruitful. As a vine reaches out for something to hang on or climb up, a good vinedresser will train its branches horizontally and vertically and provide them with support, such as wire or trellis. Our Father gives the spiritual vine its supports also. The Church doesn't exist in a vacuum, but like a vine, has to interrelate with its surroundings. The Church is placed within its wider social context, from which it draws necessary support, though not life-giving sustenance. We are not compromised by that support, which has been divinely ordered, just as a vine is not compromised by its trellis. With its supporting surroundings, a vine will have a symbiotic, even reciprocal relationship. Such support helps the vine to be more fruitful. Thus, we should not despise the context within which we exist. A good vinedresser will not make it too easy for the vine. Struggling vines tend to make the best fruit. Similarly, when we face adversity, we are more likely to remember our purpose than when we are too comfortable. A good vinedresser tries to prevent the vine from putting all its energy into making leaves and shoots, since good fruit is his goal. When a vine comes up against difficulties, such as restricted water supply, scarce nutrients or competitors for space, it tends to produce better quality fruit. Easy access to water and nutrients will produce luxurious foliage rather than the best grapes. Applied spiritually, the spiritual vine of the Church that yearns for more of the water of the Spirit and more of the nutritional feeding of the Word, will produce more of the fruit of the kingdom than the Church which doesn't know the value of either. In order to get a good crop, the vinedresser will prune. Like a good gardener, the good vinedresser will be seemingly ruthless with the plant, because he knows that if you cut back, you are more likely to produce a better result. His object is less the production of many grapes than of a better quality of fruit. Jesus says that the Father will prune us. It reminds us that when we undergo 'pruning' through the difficult experiences of life, it is not without purpose. Even if we think that God has deserted us, he has not. The discipline of the Lord produces good disciples, so divine pruning is essential, such as being obedient, coming into repentance and living sacrificially. In this light, even calamitous events carry hidden signs of grace through which God works out his ultimate purposes for our lives. The Father acts as the vinedresser with a view to our redemption. Submission to his overall care is therefore essential. Cooperating with him within the vine fulfils what is in our interest. The reality of the natural as well as the spiritual vine is that if some branches are dead, they will need to be removed so that they do not imperil the health of the plant. This is different from pruning. Jesus makes it clear that where we reject him, we cannot remain in him. Such branches wither and ultimately die. We have in a sense cut ourselves off from him by our own action, so the removal of the branch is the logical response to what has already taken place. Don't cut yourself off, come to mass, stay in the vine, and be surprised at the fruit God grows. Fr Julian

ST AUGUSTINE'S JUSTICE AND PEACE GROUP, In his reflection for Friday of the Passion of The Lord (Good Friday) a few weeks back, Pope Francis wrote: "Lord Jesus, help us to see in your Cross all the crosses of the world...the cross of people thirsty for justice and for peace."
