

YEAR B SECOND SUNDAY OF EASTER (DIVINE MERCY)

7TH APRIL 2024

Gospel: John 20: 19-31 Eight days later, Jesus came.

Christ is Risen! He is Risen Indeed. The Resurrection of Jesus changes everything. In the light of that historical event, every action, every thought and every emotion are brought into judgment, but only because of God's mercy. The mercy which stems from the cross and empty tomb is everlasting, and it has triumphed over judgement.



Through the Resurrection, God revealed in the clearest way his merciful nature, his 'everlasting mercy' as the collect says. St Peter in the epistle says that it is from God's 'great mercy', that our changed status as God's children comes. Perhaps fittingly then today is Divine Mercy Sunday, which reminds us that our faith in God's mercy alone opens the door of salvation for us. St Faustina wrote in her diary 'let every soul trust in the Passion of the Lord, and place its hope in God's mercy. God will not exhaust His mercy to anyone. Heaven and earth may change, but God's mercy will never be exhausted. Oh, what immense joy burns in my heart when I contemplate Your incomprehensible goodness, O Jesus! I desire to bring all sinners to Your feet that they may glorify Your mercy throughout endless ages.' This echoes what St Peter say in his epistle today, that it is our faith in our Heavenly Father's loving mercy in raising Jesus from the dead and giving us new birth as his children, that gives us great joy. This is in spite of the trials of life, because our faith in God's merciful love and our status in the risen Christ, define us, not the difficulties we are going through. Death, evil, darkness, sickness, war, the vices and our sins do not have the last word because Jesus has triumphed over them, through them and in them. Our faith inducing joy and our joy inducing faith completely transcend them. Nor do our faith and joy depend upon sensory perception and scientific proof. We don't have to prove everything in order to believe. Thomas wanted empirical evidence that Jesus was alive. He wanted to literally touch Jesus' body. In this respect he may have been different from some of the other disciples. Last week's gospel suggests that John, for one, believed that Jesus was raised from the dead, even before he saw the risen Lord, though admittedly he did witness the empty tomb. While Jesus calls us to have faith in him, that faith does not depend upon our seeing him with our naked eyes, granted that one day we will see him face to face. In fact, he says speaking of future generations of Christians, the likes of you and me, that we are blessed in believing regardless of not having seen him like the disciples, who in contrast 'believe because you can see me'. Our faith, love and joy do not depend upon sight. St Peter says today that though' you do not see him, yet you love him; and still without seeing him, you are already filled with a joy so glorious that it cannot be described'. Can such joy and belief accommodate doubt? I have often heard it said that doubt is not the opposite of faith. This seems to run clean contrary to what Our Lord says in the gospel today. To Thomas he says, 'doubt no longer but believe'. It looks as if Jesus wants us not to doubt at all. Jesus clearly loved Thomas in spite of whatever unanswered questions he had. We also can be assured of our Lord's love for us, just as we can be sure that Jesus wants to lead us into a deeper relationship of trust. Perhaps this is why St Faustina was led to write at the top of her Litany of Divine Mercy: 'Let the doubting soul read these considerations on Divine Mercy and become trusting. God's love is a flower and Divine Mercy its fruit'. Fittingly then the phrase which sums up devotion to the Divine Mercy is, 'Jesus I trust in you'. Do we? May we echo the closing prayer of The Litany of Divine Mercy: 'Eternal God, in whom mercy is endless and the treasury of compassion inexhaustible, look kindly upon us and increase Your mercy in us, that in difficult moments we might not despair nor become despondent, but with great confidence submit ourselves to Your holy will, which is Love and Mercy itself'.
