

YEAR B TWENTY-FOURTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME 15TH SEPT 2024

Gospel: *Mark 8: 27-35*

You are the Christ. The Son of Man is destined to suffer grievously.

On the third Sunday in September we celebrate Evangelii Gaudium, which means the Joy of the Gospel. It used to be known as Home Mission Sunday. *Evangelii Gaudium* takes up the theme of one of Pope Francis' encyclicals, calling to mind that at the heart of the gospel-its news and sharing- is joy. On the surface of it there doesn't seem to be a lot of joy in our readings, but read more deeply and we can see that joy is the outworking of all that is said. In the first reading Isaiah offers no resistance to those attacking and insulting him, but he is able to say that those attacks and insults did not touch him because he knows that he is on the side of truth and that God will come to help him and



vindicate him. Similarly, the psalmist finds himself surrounded with the snares of death, but knows that by acknowledging his helplessness and calling on the Lord's name, he will find help in time of need. 'The Lord protects the simple hearts; I was helpless so he saved me'. In the epistle of James, the apostle reminds us that faith finds its expression in the transformative power of good works. Many will rejoice at the outworking of such authentic faith, because it is orientated towards the other and not the self, and ultimately to the source of all joy, God himself. In the gospel from Mark, we hear of the hard graft of discipleship before the joy of entering into life. Jesus speaks of his destiny to suffer as his own walk of obedient discipleship. It was difficult for the disciples to hear the news that Jesus was going to suffer grievously at the hands of the religious authorities, and they would have derived at this stage little consolation from his promise that he would rise again. In fact, Peter remonstrates with him, as if Jesus could make his pathway ahead a lot smoother. Jesus then reinforces the bluntness of his message by stressing that following him entails making decisive, life-changing choices. It means renouncing one's life...one's sense of worth, security, power, destiny, and control... and taking up one's cross...entering into the humility of becoming identified with Him. Trying to save one's life on one's own terms will cause one to certainly lose it, while giving up one's life will save it. In truth however, the key to life is more involved than that. Jesus doesn't say that we will save our life if we lose it. He says that we will save our life if we lose it, 'for my sake, and for the sake of the gospel'. There are many people who have given up their lives, and in some of those cases, we have to ask, for what purpose? But to give up one's life for Jesus and for the sake of his gospel that is different. Joy comes through the way of the cross...through repentance, forgiveness, reconciliation, salvation. If we proclaim a gospel of joy detached from the call to repentance, we will be offering cheap grace. It will be all froth and no substance, all about feelings and not about a transformed heart. That's not to say that feelings aren't important-they are part of our make up-but if we base our faith on our feelings we will be like weather fanes, changing from day to day. There is of course an honesty in not covering up how we feel, but the only thing that will keep us close to Jesus- as his followers rather than his accusers- is a cross-centred existence. Entering into a profound relationship with Jesus by living for him releases the wellsprings of joy. Living out the conversion of the cross in our personal lives, especially serving the most vulnerable, brings untold joy and enables the Lord to touch others with his missionary love. Our prayer after the communion reminds us of what is possible when we surrender ourselves into Jesus' hands. 'May the working of this heavenly gift, O Lord, we pray, take possession of our minds and bodies, so that its effects, and not our own desires, may always prevail in us, through Christ our Lord'.
