A CALL TO UNITY

My Beloved Brothers and Sisters of Ss Michael and Martin's Church, Hounslow,

I feel very humbled addressing you today, Sunday 1st October, as your new Parish Priest, awaiting induction. Our beloved parish is unique in many ways. It is probably the busiest parish in the Diocese of Westminster. It is also arguably the most blessed in human resources. While we give thanks for these prospects and take pride in them, the potential challenges are not lost on us. Rest assured, united, we can stand; we can overcome and do greater things for God and for all humanity. The unity of the faithful is so fundamentally important that it was Jesus' last will before his ascension into glory. For this, he fervently prayed, noting that it is the unity of his followers that will witness most for him before the world (John 17:20-26).

The tendency of the faithful to splinter into factions was the reason St Paul wrote his First Letter to the Corinthians (1 Cor 1:11-13) where he called them out: "I appeal to you by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you agree, that there be no divisions among you, but that you be united in the same mind and the same judgment. For it has been reported ... that there is quarrelling among you, with each one of you saying, "I follow Paul," or "I follow Apollos," or "I follow Cephas," or "I follow Christ." Is Christ divided? Was Paul crucified for you? Or were you baptised in the name of Paul?"

St Paul strongly reminds the faithful of Corinth that the human leaders, including our priests, past and present, are all equally servants of the one Christ who should therefore be their focus so that no one should boast about human leaders. Worthy of note is that among the 'loyalties' Paul criticised was one with the slogan "I belong to Christ?" Why would anyone criticise such a slogan? Well, the fact is that one may have the right words and slogans and yet carry on with the same wrong attitudes of divisiveness and exclusiveness.

Thus, to heal the wounds of the divided body of Christ, over and above the right statements of faith, we need the right attitudes which spring from a recognition that we all belong to Christ. Continuing, St Paul notes that, "... there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of services, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good (1 Cor. 12:4-6).

To use the varieties of gifts God gives to His daughters and sons for the common good, as grounds for rivalry, is thus regrettable. Unity is strength. We cannot, as a fragmented body, witness effectively to Christ; preaching the love and unity, forgiveness and reconciliation that is so much needed in a fragmented world. That would be exercise in futility. Divisions and hostility among the faithful are surely a scandal; an obstacle to belief. The love that held the early Christians together so marvelled the pagans who exclaimed: "Behold, how they love one another." It was what led them to conversion in droves, above the preaching of the disciples.

In a world divided along so many lines, they were amazed to see Jews and Greeks, men and women, slaves and freemen, rich and poor sharing a common community life in love, forgiveness and mutual support. It clearly would lead people to ask, "What is the secret of this group?" One wonders what would be the verdict of onlookers on us today. Perhaps, they would rather marvel at the tendency of today's Christians to fight one another.

Writing to the Christian community in Ephesus which also had the tendency to splinter, St Paul enjoins them to "lead a life worthy of the calling to which you have been called" (Eph. 4:1). This, he remarkably clarified, meant "making every effort to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace" (Eph. 4:3). Consequently, he urges all to put aside human pride and the feelings of "I was right and you were wrong" in our work for Christian unity and reconciliation and rather go about it "with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, making every effort to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace" (Eph. 4:2-3). As Jesus our lord and master noted "every kingdom divided against itself is heading for ruin" (Mt 12: 25).

Indeed, a demanding parish like ours could only be run on the goodwill and effort of volunteers. We have received these so gratuitously and are profoundly grateful. However, responsibilities for the service of the community remain as delegated by the Parish Priest who is the visible sign of our unity. I am most grateful too to my predecessors, especially our immediate past Parish Priest, Fr Daniel who had also served the parish as Assistant Priest; for the amazing and inspiring legacy they have left behind. Our prayers go with them especially with Fr Daniel as he prepares to take up a new assignment.

Having listened to parishioners in private and in the parish meeting of last Wednesday, I was quite encouraged by the common desire for a healed and united parish. It will take commitment, sacrifice and letting go for that to be fully realised. I am fully committed to that. In furtherance of the dialogue which also includes consultation with competent authorities, I am convoking a meeting of all the parish volunteers this Thursday 5th October after the evening Mass. All Parish Volunteers should please endeavour to be present.

We are privileged as Spiritans to serve you and we are very happy to serve. We count on your continued support and prayers.

Let us pray

Father, pour out your Spirit afresh into our hearts.
Grant us a new vision of Your glory,
a new experience of Your power,
a new faithfulness to Your Word
and a new consecration to Your service,
so that Your love may grow among us and Your
kingdom come.
