## **Keynote Speaker and Workshop Leaders**

Angela Samata: She first became aware of the Survivors of Bereavement by Suicide in 2003 after her partner took his own life. With two sons, aged three and thirteen at the time, she gained a great deal of help and understanding from attending the Liverpool support group and instantly recognised the value of the work of the charity. After attending the support group for 2 years, Angela volunteered as a Helpline volunteer and also became leader of the Liverpool group. In 2006 Angela attended her first Trustees meeting to see if she could offer her skills as a press officer to the board. The offer was quickly accepted and she was voted onto the board.

In 2010 the then chair, Gill Irish, decided to step down and Angela was appointed as the chair, a position that she will hold until 2014. Along with her charity commitments, Angela works full time in the arts, and with a background in PR she also advises the Board on media and filming requests.

Workshop 1

Jacky Cliffordis a Senior Accredited Counsellor and Registered Independent Counsellor (UKRC) with BACP. She is an experienced group and individual supervisor and a trainer and facilitator of courses for counsellors and supervisors. She has been in the profession for over 20 years and was a lecturer on a Certificate in Counselling and a Foundation Degree. She has experience of working within a Hospice environment and currently supervises counsellors working in this field. Jacky also supervises within a Drop in Centre at a Cancer Hospital. She has experience within the bereavement field of people impacted by suicide within the family or close friends.

Rosemary Lamaison – is a Counsellor and Supervisor with over 20 years' experience and her work covers a broad spectrum and includes GP referrals, loss and change, relationship issues, survivors of domestic abuse, eating disorders, ex-Boarders, sexuality issues, anxiety and depression. Rosemary is also a Parent Specialistand has helped parents experiencing separation, bereavement, children who offend, as well as with everyday parenting issues in the family.

Workshop 3

Jon Wilson Cooper Dip. I.G.C. is aqualified Gestalt Psychotherapist with over 25 years' experience of therapeutic communities including work in the UK, USA and India. Jon has experience of working with people with long and enduring psychiatric problems, young offenders, people with learning difficulties and people who misuse drugs and alcohol. He is currently course leader on a Foundation Degree in Counselling course as well as being a freelance trainer, consultant and supervisor. Jon is a Director of The Albany Centre for personal and professional development in St Albans, Hertfordshire.

Workshop 4

Janet Dowling is a professional storyteller and trained psychiatric social worker who uses these approaches in her therapeutic work and for three years was the resident Therapeutic Storyteller at the Children's Trust in Tadworth, Surrey. She also works as a volunteer for Cruse Bereavement Care. She was awarded a Winston Churchill Memorial Trust Fellowship for storytelling with the dying and bereaved. She has delivered workshops in therapeutic storytelling in London, Vancouver, Kuwait City, Nazareth and Edinburgh as well as workshops at the National Cruse Bereavement Care Conference in 2007 and 2008, the Bereavement Research Forum in Nov 2008 and the Regional Cruse Conference in London 2010. Her article "ThePower of Three: Storytelling in Bereavement" was published in *Bereavement Care* in May 2010.

**Reverend Dermot O'Neill** has worked for over thirty years in pastoral ministry in parishes around greater London. As part of that ministry he encounters bereavement on a weekly basis. He has experience of dealing with grief resulting from suicide.
