During the second week of Advent, we are confronted by the fierce figure of the Baptist. John is the voice who prepares for the coming of the Word, Jesus Christ. He is the last of the OT prophets. He performs no miracles; the content of his preaching is shorter than the shortest of the prophetic books; yet Jesus declares him as the greatest of them all. Whence his greatness? While all the prophets envisioned the hope for the Messiah, none knew what he would be like or how he would come. But John could point to the One and say, 'Behold the Lamb!'. John sums up the message of the prophets in himself, but he has nothing much to say except for the people to repent – even as he points to the Coming One. He does the same today; John arrives to tell us to repent of our sins, and await the one who is the desire of our hearts.

**Christmas Carols:** *Communion & Liberation* (CL), one of the new movements in the Church, have offered to do a Carol service on the **16 December, Saturday at 4:30 PM**. This will be for an hour or so and it will finish before evening Mass at 6 PM. There will be a collection at the end for the Friends of the Holy Land, providing much needed humanitarian relief in Gaza. There will be a reception in the Crypt afterwards for those wishing to celebrate. Do come along and bring your friends!

**Reconciliation Service:** A reminder that our reconciliation service will be on the 15<sup>th</sup> Dec, Friday at 6:30 PM with visiting priests. **Mass times** for Christmas have now been published and can be obtained on the noticeboard and on the website.

**Change to Mass Times:** As announced previously, please note the change to mass times during the week: we temporarily move masses on Monday and Tuesday to the evening at 6:30 PM. We will have a half hour of Adoration on Monday evenings after Mass and a *Lectio Divina*, engaging the Sunday readings on Tuesday evenings after Mass. **Stop the 14-day limit on experimenting on embryos being removed:** The Human Fertilisation and Embryology Authority (HFEA) is pushing to remove the 14-day limit for experimenting on embryos, despite 97% of submissions from the general public to their consultation objecting to these plans.
