Advent begins next week: To help people go to Mass a bit more easily, during this season, we want to temporarily move the masses on Monday and Tuesday to the evening at 6:30 PM for Advent. Mass will be followed by Adoration for half hour on Monday evenings after Mass and Fr Jakub will be hosting a *Lectio Divina*, a way of engaging with the Scriptures to deepen our faith on Tuesday evenings after Mass.
