Would you have liked to do a Lenten retreat but been too busy to manage? Are you in need of physical or emotional healing? Would it help to talk to someone about your spiritual life and current struggles? Have you been a bit weak in your faith and could do with a spiritual boost? Or maybe you just need to experience something of God's love for yourself....? Well, for this and so much more, you need look no further than your own local parishes the coming weeks!

This week we are excited to welcome Fr Bernard of the Franciscan Friars of the Renewal. The Friars are one of the new religious orders – not new perhaps in being Franciscans – but certainly part of the new wave of movements from the time of Vatican II. They are a very dynamic, happy group of friars, who try and live out the charism of Francis very seriously. They live fully on Providence, each of them owning only two habits for themselves (no mobile phones), sleep on wooden floors, and try to live without any privileges which the poor will not be able to have for themselves. Living as a community, without even some of the comforts money provides might make for a very miserable existence, but their joy and missionary zeal is testimony to the love of Christ promised in the gospel.

We are excited to announce that they will be coming to our parishes (six of them!) on a Parish Mission. Fr Bernard will, today invite you all and hopefully enthuse you on what is in store for us. Parish missions were common even a couple of decades ago but have fallen out of fashion since. **But these are great times of grace!** And you don't have to go to a monastery to find this! We had no plans on hosting a mission this year. So much has happened, the thought seemed impossible. But we did tell God he has permission to do what he would like in this parish – and he provides us what we need. I believe God has something wonderful in store for us. The friars were due to go on mission to another parish but at the last minute that was cancelled. They generously offered to come here instead. This originally was organised with Blessed Sacrament church but the Friars were happy to involve both the churches. There is a rich morning programme each day at St John's and we have a very exciting line up of evening encounters at Blessed Sacrament. Also back is the healing service which was so powerful last time we had it. Do not miss this opportunity of grace. Give an extra hour of your week to God this Lent. Come and receive! Bring your friends. It might change everything!
