## Six Baptisms!

Eastertide is a season of rejoicing! There is much to give thanks to God for this season. We had six people baptised this Easter Vigil. Congrats to Daniella Anne Young, Robert Faustina Holliday, Rodrigo Dominic Kohn, Tzoulio Topalli, Kanty Monica Widjaja and Godswill Anthony Enyi on their journey towards the waters of baptism by which they were reborn this Easter (their new Christian names in the middle). Congrats also to Stephanie Catherine Charnley, Caoimhe Anna Griffin and Marco Francis Patti received the Sacrament of Confirmation along with the new catechumens on Easter night. This is in addition to Ange Bledown and Linda Omaonyeka who were baptised at Blessed Sacrament (and Joaquin to be baptised delayed this coming Sunday) and Pauline Williams received into the Church from the Anglican Communion. Baptism is always a miracle. God makes us, creatures and unworthy as we are, into his sons and daughters. It is a miracle when it happens to a baby but in an adult we can see clearly the wonderful hand of God's Providence as he has led those he has called, through and in spite of any and all circumstances in which they might find themselves. Some of our baptised grew up familiar with Christianity, others indifferent and yet others, atheists. Their questions, doubts, assurances were all different. They are not people who would naturally choose each other as friends, yet they were brought together in our two Churches, and they journeyed together the last nine months. They were ably assisted in this journey by David Lester our RCIA catechist to whom we owe many thanks! In this journey these candidates were not too different from the disciples Jesus called, who wouldn't have chosen each other by themselves but were bonded by the love and Spirit of Christ. This week they came together to reflect on their experience of the Triduum and particularly the Easter Vigil. They remarked how moving and powerful it had been, the sadness and love at Maundy Thursday, the condescension of Christ in washing his disciples feet, the power of the Cross on Good Friday and the glory of Christ revealed through the Readings, the aspects of light and darkness, the music and all the rich symbols during the Easter Vigil. They remarked on how welcome they felt in the Church and the love shown by all in welcoming them as her newest members! We hope to continue on a post-baptismal journey as a small group to deepen their faith. Others will be welcome to join in this! For now, and for the next few weeks, I will be publishing short testimonies of our catechumens and candidates so you can share in their journey for yourself!

Corpus Christi Procession: Easter inaugurates 50 days of Rejoicing which culminate in Pentecost on 19<sup>th</sup> May. In between, the next Sunday will be Good Shepherd Sunday, 21<sup>st</sup> April, when we pray for vocations to the priesthood; the Solemnity of the Ascension, Thursday 9th May. Two weeks after Pentecost, 2<sup>nd</sup> June is Corpus Christi when we hope to have a Eucharistic Procession following the 11 AM Mass to Blessed Sacrament. We are seeking permission from the Council at the moment, more details to follow!

**Baptism Preparation:** Those wanting their children to be baptised need to attend a session for preparation for baptism. Our next preparation session is this Monday, 15<sup>th</sup> April at 6 PM in the Presbytery.
