Kajetan always taught me important life lessons and one that especially sticks by me is his expression through music. There would not be a single time in the day with or without him where he was not listening to music and I truly believe this gave him a better outlook and understanding of the world.

The amazing group of friends we spent last summer with, sitting under the summer sun enjoying life as any child should. I recall all the late nights in Cambridge with him going out because we were bored and should have been revising for our A level mocks, but I am so grateful that I got to spend that time with him and I would have not had it any other way. To put everything in perspective he was my first friend and walked over to me in reception and ever since then a formidable friendship was created. He helped me achieve so many things within my life such as being a more confident person and not being annoyed at everyone for one silly mistake. He's even the reason I'm with my girlfriend now.

It's upsetting to think about all the things that were yet to come, but then I remember everything that we had already achieved together.

I would like to thank Gemma and Janusz for being like second parents to me with all the amount of time I spent in their house in the last few years I should be paying rent to them. Similarly, thank you Fabian you were like my little brother as we would sometimes go out all together.

Finally, I want you all to continue the legacy of Kajetan as everything I achieve in life will be in his name. He will remain by all of your sidesand it is unfathomable how much he loved all of you not then not now but forever.
