Our readings celebrate the Lord's closeness to us. Created through God and for God, we are drawn ever closer to God by peace and reconciliation. More than this, we are called to become like the Lord in our service of other people, especially the poor. The author of the Book of Deuteronomy commands us to love and gives us the means to do so. The law, or the word, is not beyond our reach but is as close to us as our hearts. The help and compassion of the Lord for the poor and needy will be seen through our service; in this way, says the Psalmist in Psalm 68, our hearts will revive. Writing to the community of the Church at Colossae, Paul makes clear all is made possible by Christ and his cross. He holds everything in being from the beginning and, even now, is drawing us together in deeper unity. The well-known parable of the Good Samaritan, which only Luke shares with us, shows us a concrete example of what service, the command to love without bias or prejudice, looks like. We pray this week we may have renewed trust, hope and confidence in the Good Samaritan who comes close to us in our need. May we reach out so God's desire for all people be clearly seen by our loving response. We pray too for the peace of the world and for all who suffer as a result of war, conflict and violent attack.
