# From The Presbytery Window

### The apostles said to the Lord, Increase our faith.

Our readings invite us to reflect on trust and faithfulness. They remind us to be patient. The prophet Habbakuk feels the Lord isn't listening when he asks why nothing is being done about the violence and outrage he sees. The Lord reassures him whatever the surrounding circumstances, the upright person will remain faithful, trusting in God. In the Gospel, Jesus teaches about faith and service when the apostles ask him, 'Increase our faith!' He moves them away from considering faith as a quantity to encouraging them to put into practice the faith they do have. Jesus uses a mustard seed to demonstrate the power of faith. He cautions the disciples about knowing one's place in God's plans, rather than having an attitude of what's in it for me? Our relationship with God is total, demanding unconditional love and service. Paul reminds us the gift of faith in Christ is the Spirit of power, love and selfcontrol. Armed with this Spirit we are 'never to be ashamed of witnessing to the Lord', even if it means going against the tide or enduring hardship. Psalm 94 urges us, 'O that today you would listen to his voice!' We come before the Lord with open hearts, giving thanks and praise and pray for a deepening of our faith and trust in God, for guidance to use our precious God-given gifts with a servant's heart. We remember those suffering war and conflict in Ukraine and elsewhere.
