Our scripture readings highlight the importance of gratitude. Gratitude is a perfect response to the Lord's constant goodness to us. Whatever cleansing we are seeking or hardships we are bearing the Lord has been, is, and will work for our good. Psalm 97 reminds us he will do this on our behalf through his right hand and holy arm. However wavering our own stance to God might be, God is always faithful to us. For St Ignatius, ingratitude was 'the most abominable of all sins'. In the Gospel it is a Samaritan who turns back to give thanks for his healing. Jesus appreciates this and encourages him in his faith, something the other nine miss. For a Church open to everyone:

We pray for the Church; ever faithful to, and courageous in preaching the Gospel, may the Church be a community of solidarity, fraternity and welcome, always living in an atmosphere of *synodality*. The synodal process that we are following is entering its second stage. In this stage, the goal is the same: "to synod." That is to say, "to walk together." "It's not about gathering opinions, nor holding a parliament," but rather "listening to each other in our diversity and opening doors to those who are outside the Church." And by listening to "the protagonist, the Holy Spirit," which requires prayer, the Synod can become an "opportunity to be a Church of closeness, which is God's style."
