For You the Sun of Righteousness will Shine Out with Healing in its Rays

As we approach the end of the Church's year, our readings lead us to think about the passage of time and the end of the world. Though outwardly daunting, they provide a message of hope for those who stay faithful to God's love. The prophet Malachi uses stark imagery to portray the fate of those who do not respect the Lord. But the ones who remain faithful to him will see the day which is coming as a time of joy and healing. Jesus predicts the destruction of the Temple in Jerusalem, but tells us not to fear wars, persecution and natural disasters. While these things may seem like the end, in fact they are not. He cautions us not to be deceived by those claiming, 'the time has come'. Even when in difficulty, we are not to worry about what to say, the Spirit of Jesus will give us words and wisdom as we bear witness to Christ. By staying secure in the love God has for us, we will be held safe. Paul presents himself as a model to the Thessalonian church, spreading the Good News and earning his keep. He stresses the importance of the whole community working for the good of all, rather than sitting around thinking about the future. Psalm 97 provides the certainty of the Lord's coming, when justice will prevail. All creation is invited to join in the joyful proclamation of that coming. This week we can pray for trust and inner strength, keeping Christ at our side and responding to him in every moment of our lives, as we continue to pray for the peace of the world. Fr Jimmv
