FIRST READING: Zepheniah 2: 3, 3:12–13

*In your midst I will leave a humble and a lowly people.* 

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: Ps 145: 7-10 response Matthew 5:3 How happy are the poor in spirit; theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

# How happy are the poor in spirit; theirs is the kingdom of heaven

God's Word reveals what we need to follow Christ and become more like him. Getting our priorities right, in God's eyes, may not be easy nor is it always the way of the world, but it will bring happiness in God's kingdom. At the beginning of his Sermon on the Mount Jesus teaches the Beatitudes, focusing on the qualities he expects disciples to have. They are not rules like the commandments, more a road map for discipleship, laying out the way in which we are to follow the Lord. Jesus calls us to learn what it really means to be glad and rejoice in him alone. The Beatitudes are a restatement of the values shown in our first reading from the prophet Zephaniah. The Lord will protect those living honest and just lives so they become people of integrity and humility. In prayerful response, Psalm 145 sings of the Lord's faithfulness and kindness, praising God for God's care of those who are oppressed; the hungry, the imprisoned, the blind and the stranger. Paul reminds the Corinthians, and us, why they have been chosen by God. Their gift of faith is entirely due to God's generosity; in God they have found wisdom, holiness and freedom. We pray we recognise the blessings the Lord has given us, so we walk more closely with him in his work just as he walks with us in our lives. We continue to pray for those suffering war and conflict in Ukraine and many other parts of our world.
