The Solemnity of the Nativity of the Lord, 24th – 25th December 2022

After the annual celebration of the Paschal Mystery at Easter, the Church has no more ancient custom than celebrating the Solemnity of the Nativity of the Lord. We celebrate the mystery of the Incarnation by which the Word of God humbled himself to share in our humanity, in order that he might enable us to become sharers in his divinity. Each year we hear the Christmas Gospel from Luke. We know the story well; during the reign of Caesar Augustus, Jesus is born in Bethlehem and angels bring to shepherds news of great joy. At the prompting of the angels, Glory to God in the highest, the shepherds go to Bethlehem, finding everything as they had been told. As for Mary, she treasured all these things and pondered them in her heart. Although the story is well known, we listen to it again so we might be changed by it. We open our minds and hearts to the Lord and allow him to be born in us. Amongst all the busyness of these days, and the busyness of our lives, we are called to ponder the mystery of the Lord's nativity in our hearts too.
