26th February 2023 First Sunday of Lent Year A: A pure heart create for me, O God

Having begun our annual observance of Lent we may want to consider, how am I to celebrate this season. Lent means spring-time or the lengthening of days. It's a time for renewal, of coming back to life in nature and looking forward. We are invited in Lent to renew our life with and for God. Lent is a time for us to recognise the love of God made visible in creation; a time to notice the ways in which we fall short of God's desires for us and for our world. We pray for the grace to live more fully according to God's way. We are familiar with giving up for Lent, perhaps this year our giving up may be the things in our life which get in the way of valuing all God has given us and allowing God to deepen God's life in us. It may help to take time to notice and speak with our Lord about what this means for me. Our readings speak of our choice to listen to God's voice or be tempted by evil. Adam and Eve succumb to the tempting voice, but Jesus is steadfast in his rejection of temptation. Psalm 50 is a prayer of one who knows their own sinfulness, but who also knows God's love and mercy are more powerful than their weakness. Paul celebrates the freedom from sin Jesus brings us, his gift of love overcomes our sin and brings us to life. In Lent, we ask for the grace to become more aware of God's compassion and love for us, ready to journey with Jesus to his death on the cross and celebrate his resurrection.
