FIRST READING: Acts 2: 42-47

COLLECT: God of everlasting mercy, who, in the very recurrence of the paschal feast kindle the faith of the people you have made your own, increase, we pray, the grace you have bestowed, that all may grasp and rightly understand in what font they have been washed, by whose Spirit they have been reborn, by whose Blood they have been redeemed. **Amen.**

Second Sunday of Easter, 16th April 2023 Year A,

'As the Father sent me, so I am sending you'

This Sunday has the greatest collection of titles of any Sunday in the Church's Year! The Octave, or Eighth Day, of Easter; the Second Sunday of Easter; Divine Mercy Sunday; the Sunday in White, or Domenica in Albis, when the newly baptised were presented to the Bishop wearing the white robe with which they were clothed at their Baptism during the Easter Vigil. From the anointing with oil which followed, the Sacrament of Confirmation grew. Today with Thomas, we hail Christ as our Lord and God. We, too, ask to be filled with the joy and peace of the disciples in seeing the risen Lord. Luke, in the Acts of the Apostles, the second volume of his Gospel, tells us how effectively the lives of the first Christians are encouraged and transformed by their Spirit-filled faith. Their devout, generous sense of community is an inspiration to all who meet them. Psalm 117, which we prayed sang on Easter Sunday, is considered the Easter Psalm above all others. All Christians are invited to give thanks and praise to the Lord just as our Jewish brothers and sisters sang this Psalm in the Temple. Peter, an eye-witness to the Easter events, in his first letter encourages and praises the faith of the new converts, despite them never having seen Jesus. Although they are persecuted and plagued by trials because of their new-found faith in Christ, they still love the Lord deeply and are filled with a glorious joy. In his Gospel, John recounts the events of Easter and the first Sunday after Easter, today. Thomas is absent when the risen Lord appears to the other frightened disciples. Jesus offers them the resurrection gift of the Spirit of peace. A week later, Jesus seeks out the doubting Thomas personally, an encounter which enables Thomas to proclaim Jesus as, 'My Lord and my God!'.



THE LETTER SCREENING

In support of the activities organised by Westminster Justice & Peace for climate action in the Diocese, our Parish is holding a screening of the movie THE LETTER on Sunday 23rd April at 3pm. THE LETTER is a documentary film by Emmy-winning director Nicolas Brown, released in October 2022 by the Laudato Si' Movement. The title refers to Pope Francis' encyclical letter Laudato Si': On Care for Our Common Home, written in 2015 and addressed to 'every person living on this planet'. In the film, Pope Francis himself describes how the encyclical came about, and we hear something of the reaction that followed its publication. The film's protagonists represent four voices from the world's peripheries, deeply impacted by climate change: we see a letter going to each of them, containing an invitation to a personal dialogue with Pope Francis.

Following the movie, refreshments will be available. We invite parishioners to attend and invite others to join us. The event is free of charge. Donations can be made on the day to CAFOD towards their work to combat climate change and its impact on the most vulnerable communities.

A MESSAGE FROM CAFOD on THE BIG ONE

The Big One is a four-day action from the 21st to the 24th of April 2023, where people from many groups and movements will gather at the Houses of Parliament. Indeed over 100 groups are taking part, including the Laudato Si' Movement, Christian Climate Action, Green Christian and CAFOD. We are demanding that the Government faces the reality of the climate crisis. We need to bring an end to the fossil fuel era, pollution and loss of biodiversity. The four-day Big One event has been agreed with the police, and should prove to be stressfree, cheerful, family-friendly and, for many, prayerful.

- Friday 21st is Unite to Survive, when it is hoped most people will attend
- Saturday 22nd is Earth Day a celebration

- and a family-friendly march for biodiversity.
- Sunday 23rd is Running Out of Time (The Big One coexists with the London Mara-thon).
- Monday 24th is Choose Your Future Parliament returns, the demand is delivered.

Gather from 11.15am on the 21st in the garden at St John's Waterloo (or inside if wet) for Music from Engage Worship and hopefully The Salvation Army. Then at 12 noon there will be a service. At 1pm they will pilgrimage to Parliament Square (this will be step-free), to gather in front of Central Methodist Hall. At 2pm there will be prayers for the government and a blessing on the rally.

In addition, Christian Climate Action has organised the following events:

On 22nd, an 11am gathering at Parliament for worship at 12 noon focused on racial and climate justice, with a Catholic Mass at 3pm On 23rd, the 12 noon service will be led by young people, with an Anglican Eucharist at 3pm.

On 24th, the 12 noon service will focus on looking to the future.
