From the Presbytery Window

Their eyes were opened, and they recognised him.

Our readings remind us of the gifts Jesus' resurrection has brought for us. Joy, glory, praise, hope and faith are woven through each reading, inviting us to share again in the Eastertide celebration. Peter reminds the crowd, in spite of the terrible injustice done to Jesus, God has shown victory over death and raised Jesus to glory. With this comes the power of the Holy Spirit, now outpoured for all people. The Psalmist rejoices in the God who stands ready to protects us from all dangers, who will show us the path to everlasting happiness.

Peter speaks, in the first sermon preached after the resurrection, of how Jesus gave his life as a ransom for our sins. Because of this, all who believe can have faith and hope in God. We join two of Jesus's disciples on their journey to Emmaus, blind to the identity of the risen Lord as he walks with them. When Jesus reveals himself to them in the breaking of bread, they recognise him, just as he disappears from their sight. Unlike the disciples, we have never seen Jesus in the flesh. Because of the faith we have received, we can see and recognise Jesus in the people and situations around us. We pray this week, for the wisdom and courage to respond wherever we see Jesus in the needs of others.

ARCHITECTURAL DRAWINGS

Last Wednesday at Mass, I asked the people, where ever they were, to stop at 12 noon and pray for a miracle. It worked. Miracles do happen and we are now the proud owners of an historic piece, which has always belonged to our parish, to the first Garden City, and which will shortly be back in our possession. Around 1907, Fr. Adrian Fortescue, Rector of Letchworth and our first Parish Priest, asked Mr. Charles Spooner to produce architectural draw-



ings for our original Church, opened in 1908. On 19th April, these drawings came up for in 2015 and addressed to 'every person auction in Edinburgh, with a guide price of living on this planet'. Following the mov-£800 - £1,200. On my instruction and having ie, refreshments will be available. We intaken both independent and internal advice, our parish acquired these drawings for £2000, the total cost after fees being £2,520.
