You must love your neighbour as yourself

The quality of our listening runs through our readings. We're called to listen to the word of God, listen to our hearts, to one another and to our community. These challenge us to love one another truly, speaking out where necessary. Just as Jesus became our brother and made himself responsible for us, he asks we do the same for others. God appoints the prophet Ezekiel as his sentry, a mouthpiece to sound a warning when danger appears. We are to be aware, looking out for each other, helping one another rather than simply looking on. Jesus echoes this in the Gospel, advising us what to do when things go wrong in relationships within a community. He gives us a three-part model: we're to try to work things out one-toone; invite those we can trust to listen and advise; finally, asking the community to help bring back those who have strayed. Jesus asks us not to give up on people, even when they do not listen. St Paul emphasizes to the Romans love underpins our relationships. Our lives and our are love are guided by the ten commandments, summed up in the phrase, love your neighbour as yourself. Psalm 94 praises God, urging us to listen to the Lord with open hearts. As we continue celebrating the Season of Creation until 4th October with the theme, Let Justice and Peace Flow, we embrace the beauty of God's Kingdom, praying for the grace to be good neighbours to each other and to the whole of creation, restoring and caring for, all God has made.
