# I HAVE MY BANQUET ALL PREPARED. COME TO THE WEDDING!'

As the end of the liturgical year approaches, our readings focus on the kingdom of heaven and the era beyond the end of time. Both our first reading and Gospel invite us to contemplate sharing in the great feast God prepares for us. Isaiah explains how the Lord is preparing a banquet to which everyone will be welcome. There will be no more suffering or death. In contrast, the Gospel parable speaks of guests invited by the king to a great wedding feast but fail to attend. As a result, the king instructs his servants to ask everyone they can find good and bad alike to replace those who have made excuses. Psalm 22 reminds us the Lord will see to all our needs so we shall not want. In his letter to the Christian community in Philippi, Paul says despite imprisonment and a probable death sentence, he has achieved a calm and accepting attitude to life through total trust and faith in the Lord. We might want to reflect on the way we respond when the Lord invites us to join him and how we treat his messengers. In turn, we recognise our call to invite those who have been left by the wayside, good or bad. *Fr. Jimmy*
