Oh, that you would tear the heavens open and come down.

God of hosts, bring us back; let your face shine on us and we shall be saved.

We are waiting for our Lord Jesus Christ to be revealed.

GOSPEL: Mark 13: 33-37

Stay awake, because you do not know when the master of the house is coming.

COLLECT: Grant your faithful, we pray, almighty God, the resolve to run forth to meet your Christ with righteous deeds at his coming, so that, gathered at his right hand, they may be worthy to possess the heavenly Kingdom. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. **Amen.**

STAY AWAKE! BE READY!

As the Advent season begins the Church's Liturgical Year, our readings focus on the coming of Christ at the end of time and on his coming into our own lives. Isaiah describes the people of Israel, newly returned from exile, and finding the task of rebuilding their land and their lives difficult. They plead with God their Father to come and help them, 'Return, for the sake of your servants', they have done penance, trusting God will return, 'Oh, that you would tear the heavens open and come down'. Psalm 79 continues the theme, appealing to God, 'the shepherd of Israel', to come to the help of his people. Paul writes to the Corinthians of his gratitude for the graces they have received. Their strong Christian witness and the gifts of the Spirit they have been given will stand them in good stead when the Lord returns on the last day. Jesus uses images familiar to his hearers to warn them to remain alert and awake, as a doorkeeper would, so they won't be caught off guard. We pray to enter this season of Advent trusting the Lord will come, as he came in history at Christmas, as he comes in our hearts if we keep our door open, and as he will come at the end of time. We pray for all those in our world waiting with longing and hope for freedom from oppression and for peace. *Fr Jimmy*
