EPIPHANY OF THE LORD

The Magi bearing gifts have followed the star that appeared as a mysterious sign in the night sky. They travelled from the East over mountain and desert. In their longing to understand the meaning of this twinkling light, they persevered on their hard journey through very long, cold nights and short days. Tiredness and weariness must have been part of their wintry journey.

They enter the house of the Holy Family where they see the Child with his mother Mary and his mother Mary and his protector Joseph. Their house has the welcome and warmth of a home that is full of love. They offer gifts to the innocent and fragile child who is utterly dependent on his mother and St Joseph, they pay homage to a new king. They see both a baby and a king. They recognise him as their God. T.S. Eliot writes in his poem *The Journey of the Magi* about their homeward journey:

We returned to our places, these Kingdoms,
But no longer at ease here, in the old dispensation,
With an alien people clutching their gods.
I should be glad of another death.

They know their world has been changed and they no loner fit into it the same way. They begin to find the meaning of the Messiah who will save his people in the Jewish Scriptures. All the people have been sent a redeemer who will free them from their sins. He has been born in poverty in Bethlehem. As we affirm the Feast of the Epiphany, we affirm our belief in Jesus Christ, true God, true man, light of the nations.

Let us pray that the Spirit help us recognize the gift of different charisms within the Christian community, and to discover the richness of different ritual traditions in the heart of the Catholic Church. *Amen*

YEAR OF PRAYER - 2024

The Holy Father has decided that 2025 will be a year of Jubilee, something which happens every 25 years. The theme is "Pilgrims of Hope", and it will be a year of hope for a world suffering the impacts of war, the ongoing effects of COVID-19 pandemic, and a climate crisis.

After the year devoted to reflecting on the documents and studying the fruits of the Second Vatican Council, Pope Francis has proposed that 2024 should be marked as a year dedicated to prayer. In preparation for the Jubilee, dioceses are invited to promote initiatives to remind people of the centrality of both individual prayer and community prayer. One idea might be for "pilgrimages of prayer" to be organised at a diocesan level – these would be effectively courses or 'schools of prayer' with monthly or weekly meetings, presided over by the local bishops, but open to the entire People of God. In addition, to help mark this year more fruitfully, the Dicastery for Evangelisation will publish a series of "Prayer Notebooks", with material taken from the many forms of prayer to be found in the rich Catholic tradition. 1.PRAYER TODAY: A CHALLENGE TO OVERCOME by Angelo Comastri prefaced by Pope Francis; 2. PRAYING WITH THE PSALMS by Gianfranco Ravasi; 3. THE PRAYER OF JESUS by Juan Lopez Vergara; 4. PRAYING WITH SAINTS AND SIN-NERS by Paul Brendan Murray; 5. PARA-BLES ON PRAYER by Antonio Pitta; 6. THE CHURCH IN PRAYER By a monk; 7. THE PRAYER OF MARY AND THE SAINTS by Catherine Aubin; 8. THE PRAY-ER JESUS TAUGHT US: THE "OUR FA-THER" by Ugo Vanni.

These resources are intended for any faithful who wishes to prepare for the Jubilee. If you want to join one of the existing prayer groups or are interested in forming a new one, please get in touch with the parish office so we can make one of parish rooms available for

meetings.

The *Pontifical Bull of Indiction* is expected to be published, as per tradition, on Ascension the year before the Jubilee. For the 2025 Jubilee, publication is expected on 9th May 2024.
