What's Another Year?

Three years ago this week, the Diocese asked us to invite families and friends to form the biggest "bubble" possible before they decided which of the extra Masses they would come to that we were to offer on Christmas Day. All of this was to maximize the capacity of our churches during the Covid pandemic so that, hopefully, no-one would be turned away from celebrating the birth of our Saviour in the proper way.

Now there are no restrictions on the number that can attend Mass for Christmas. In a sense, the tortuous paths to Christ's coming of which Isiah and John the Baptist speak in today's readings have been made straight. There are no external obstacles to the fullest celebration possible of our Faith. Normal service has been resumed.

But the call to straighten the path of the coming of the Lord is not an ancient or even recent historical one nor just about being ready for His future coming, the eschaton or Parousia-it is also about facilitating His coming to us every day. So, since the Scriptures speak to us now, what are the barriers to Christ's coming that we are asked to take down in 2023?

Each of us has valleys, dark moods formed by worry and worsened by the long nights and short days when we feel overly sorry for ourselves and overlook God's attempts to console us with His Word and His Real Presence in the Eucharist. And even when we do look at these difficult issues, sometimes we deal with them using only the giddy heights of our arrogant self-reliance, thinking we can lift ourselves all the way to salvation only to find that it is all too much for us alone. As for the cliffs and ridges, these are the things that seem so much more important during Advent when it merely becomes a countdown to Christmas Day, all the things which need to be organised for that wonderful celebration which can take over our lives. And then, even when these obstacles have been levelled, the debris and weeds remain to be tidied away to smooth the Lord's coming to us.

The very beginning of the Good News has John asking the faithful people to declutter their lives, to repent of their sinful and negative ways, to create a smooth path for Christ. Now is the time to make that highway and we begin that process by acknowledging that we need the Lord in our lives. Perhaps we e don't always make His coming to us easy, especially as we are back to shoe-horning our Faith into already busy lives. But while it is just another ordinary year, let us recapture the sense of loss we feared in 2020. As we do, let us resolve to make this not just another Advent, but one where Christ's coming really means something-through Confession, straighten the path of Christ to come to us in the Eucharist that the Prince of Peace may calm and heal all our worries this year and always.
