### Surprise! Surprise!

For those of you as old as me, yes, there will be a nod to Cilla Black's famous catchphrase in a moment. But first, some Scriptural exegesis... As many of you know, there is a three-year cycle of Sunday readings—year A, B and C. In years B and C, the Gospel for today's solemnity speak of Christ's Kingship even though they are mocking references to it by Pontius Pilate at Jesus' trial and the Jews standing at the foot of the cross respectively. But this year the Gospel is all about us sharing in that Kingship as a reward for living a virtuous life. For once, it is all about me, Fr Alex!

This call expands on last week's Gospel. Then we were told it is not enough to do nothing with the gifts and talents we have been given. Today, precisely what we are supposed to do is spelt out for us in no uncertain terms—feed and water the hungry and thirsty, welcome the stranger, clothe the naked, visit the sick and those imprisoned. In other words, carry out six of what the Church calls the seven Corporal Works of Mercy.

But there is an added dimension to this. Notice that the virtuous don't get a fabulously unexpected reward drawn from the bottom of God's tombola—they get the place prepared for them since the foundation of the world. It is something God had already set aside for them. It was His expectation that they would live reminds me of Penny such а virtuous life. This the old Catechism which asks the question. "Why did God make me?" The answer? "God made me to love Him and serve Him in this life and to be happy with Him in the next". In other words, a virtuous life simply merits what God had mind for us in the first place. Such a noble life and our seat at the banqueting table in the Kingdom of Heaven are presumed of us by God.

But at the other end of the scale, those who do not act in a positively virtuous way forfeit their reward and get the place of the devil and his angels—they are, in a sense, cut off from humanity for eternity because they isolated themselves from the needy in this world. Thus, not doing good is to miss an open goal, to throw away what is our inheritance from the moment we were created. And since our Baptismal pledge is to "love God and our neighbour" and our lives are nourished by the Word of God at Mass every Sunday, we cannot say that we do not know precisely what Christ is asking us to do so as to share in His Kingship.

St John Chrysostom harmonises the spiritual and apostolic (active) life with our reward in God's Kingdom: "We paint this house of our souls, adorn it, with the beaten gold of good works; and for walls and stones embellish it with faith and generosity; and for its roof, we put prayer on the top."

Our King offers a reward that is part of our loving creation. But if our love isn't active, it should be no surprise, surprise that we forfeit this. *Fr Kevin*
