Tempus Fugit

Having celebrated the feast of the Presentation of the Lord on Friday, today the stable is empty. As St Luke writes, "And He [Jesus] went down with them and came to Nazareth, and was obedient to them [Mary and Joseph]" (Lk 2:51a). This tiny phrase summarises 30 years of the life of Christ, the hidden years as they are called, before John the Baptist heralds the start of our Saviour's ministry.

For us, those 30 years will end in 10 days when Lent begins on 14 February. From then on, as we unite ourselves to Christ's fast for 40 days before His work began, the scriptures will move us, day by day, to a deeper contemplation of the passion and death of Jesus.

But returning to the Presentation, I am always struck by how it is the last time that Our Lady holds her child in her arms until his broken body is pressed to her heart after His crucifixion and death. Hence, at that celebration in the temple, Simeon pointed out that a sword will pierce the heart of Mary, a prophecy about the appalling death her son would undergo to free us from our sins and the pain that will cause she who was conceived without sin.

For us, all too often Lent can become a little like a heathy option or a detox. But it is really about coming to acknowledge how each of us has contributed to the Passion of the Christ though our own sinfulness. Yes, we have rejoiced in the birth of our Saviour and joined in the adoration of the shepherds and the wise men. But I bet that seems like a distant memory and "normal" life has resumed, devoid of the great joy of Christmas only a few weeks ago.

And that is why the source of our ashes is so important. We can buy them from church suppliers, but better still is to make our own. Thus we invite you to bring us your palms from last year before next Sunday, the palms we waved to welcome Christ as our Redeemer. No doubt our enthusiasm has waned since then, even more so than in the short time since 25 December. And thus we will then bless and burn those palms, suing the ashes to mark ourselves on Ash Wednesday, a stark reminder of how unsteady our faith can be.

Tempus fugit, time flies, but Lent beginning so soon after Christmas is a real opportunity to hold the infant Christ and our broken Saviour, both one and the same Jesus Christ, close to our hearts. Canon Kevin
