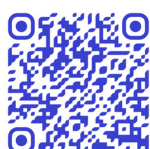

### Do You See What I See?



This painting of the Resurrection by Piero della Francesca has two vanishing points, two "eye points" from which the picture should be viewed in order to better understand it. One is the centre of the tomb because the guards' faces are viewed from below. The other is the face of the Risen Lord.

The first draws attention to the guards being asleep as a symbol of death. But the second one, Christ is quite the reverse: His raised foot shows Him in the very act of rising, carrying a flag of victory which symbolises His sinless purity (white) having shed His blood on the cross (red) for our sins. And His athletic figure, marked by only one wound, rises over the "dead" in the early light of dawn where even the trees come back to life.

Yet His humanity is not at all diminished: His coarse-featured face and those three folds of skin that wrinkle at His waist as He raises His left leg emphasise His twofold nature as both man and God. So whatever is happening in your lives, take solace in this image and the words of Pope Leo: "Faced with our fragile humanity, Christ's Resurrection becomes...

nourishing hope in the face of the frightening challenges that life presents us with every day on a personal and global level." Sr Brigid and I pray you will see that hope risen today and so have the most holy, peaceful and happy Easter.
