The Lord Heals

In our Gospel account, we see our Lord healing the sick: first, it's Peters mother-in-law who was in bed with a fever, taking her by the hand, heals her and helps her up to her feet; then all the sick in Capernaum are brought to him and he cures them and cast out many devils. The four Evangelists agree that this liberation from illness and infirmity of one form or another-together with his preaching was our Lord's main activity in his ministry.

Illness is seen as the action of evil in the world and in people, whereas healing shows us that the Kingdom of God, God himself, is at work. Our Lord came to defeat evil at its root, and healing is an anticipation of his triumph, through his Death and Resurrection.

Recall how our Lord said, 'Its, not the healthy who needs the doctor but the sick.' On this occasion, he was referring to sinners, whom he came to call and save. It's true that illness is a human condition in which we feel we are not self-sufficient that we are in need of others!

Many times illness can be a trial that can be long and difficult. When healing does not happen and suffering is prolonged, we find ourselves isolated, and we find our life is depressed and even at times dehumanised. How then should we tackle this attack of evil? Certainly, with treatment, medication and in this decade medicine has made tremendous advances and aren't we all grateful-But our Lord teaches us that there is an attitude with which we ought to face illness and it's faith in God, in his goodness and our Lord constantly repeats this to the people he heals:' My daughter,' he said 'your faith has restored you to health; go in peace and be free from your complaint' (Mk 5: 34-36).

Even at death's door, faith can make possible what is humanly impossible. One may ask faith in what? In the love of God. Here in lies the answer which will defeat evil. Just as our Lord confronted the Devil (Evil One) with the power of love that came to him from the Father, we too can confront and live through the pain of illness, keeping our hearts fully immersed in God's love.

We have all met with people who were able to bear excruciating suffering because God has given them such serenity, nevertheless, in illness we, yes all of us need human warmth: to comfort those who are sick, what counts far more than words is serene and sincere closeness.

A Statement of Fr. Firas Aridah

In a Middle East region that continues to suffer the consequences of violence, the people, of Palestine, Christians, and Moslems, continue to live under occupation and exile, and Israelis as a normal consequence of their own violence imposed on Palestinians, continue to live in insecurity.

Palestinian Christians, the descendants of the first Christians, are an integral part of the Palestinian people, continue to suffer, just like all Palestinians, Christians, Muslims, and Samaritans. We have been denied our national and human rights for a century. From Jerusalem, our occupied capital, we send our urgent message to the whole world and particularly to all the nations of the world: We are yearning for justice and peace. Recognising Palestine is the first step towards that goal.

We have endured dispossession and forced exile since 1948 when the majority of Palestine's Christians were forcibly expelled from their homes in the Holy Land. We have persevered through 69 years of exile and 50 years of occupation, holding on to the message of peace of our Lord. But now, we are tired of calls for 'useless and a-priori sterile' negotiations, while we cant reach our churches due to a foreign power and our people continue to be humiliated by an undesirable occupation. We need UN decisions to be applied. We need the recognition of the simple human principle: no people has the right to impose his occupation on another people. We are waiting for the day when our churches will ring their bells celebrating freedom and justice for all Palestinians and Israelis.

Christians have a duty to resist oppression. Israeli military Occupation is oppression. We believe the international community and particularly all the nations of the world has not done enough in order to achieve a just and lasting peace. You cannot continue holding our right to freedom and self-determination as an Israeli prerogative. We have a natural right to be free and all nations of the world has a moral, legal and political duty to hold Israel accountable towards the nonapplication of the decisions of the UN and support Palestinians in their violent resistance to end the Israeli occupation, including the recognition of the State of Palestine on the 1967 border with East Jerusalem as its capital.

Until when will you continue accepting Isreal's violations of your own resolutions? Until when will you allow that the prospects of peace will continue to be destroyed by Israeli colonisation and settlements? Until when should Israelis be allowed to treat us as foreigners in our own homeland? Ending Israeli occupation is the only way for Israelis and Palestinians, Christians, and Muslims, and all the people of the Holy Land, to enjoy a life of prosperity and progress. It is also the surest way to secure continued Christian presence in this, our Holy Land, and to grant Israel the security that it continues to demand. Without Justice, there can be no peace nor security for anyone, living here.

It's time for all the nations of the world to understand that the only way to defeat extremism and terrorism in our region is to bring justice for all, starting by ending the historic injustice inflicted against the Palestinian people, an open wound that continues to bleed, as the hopes for an Independent Palestinian state becomes elusive due to the expansion of Israeli settlements and the many restrictions imposed on our people, including forced displacement.

In our Kairos document, we Palestinian Christians, declare that the Israeli occupation of Palestinian land is a sin against God and humanity because it deprives human beings of their basic human rights, bestowed by God.

We believe that recognising the State of Palestine on the 1967 border is the first step towards changing the current status quo. Banning settlement products and divesting from companies and organisations linked directly or indirectly to the Israeli occupation is a must. 69 years after the beginning of the Palestinian Nakba in 1948 and 50 years after the occupation in 1967, it's time for the State of Palestine to be free and become a full member of the United Nations. It's time for Israel to see where it could find its own security, present, and future. It's time for Israel to see that for its military power and violence against Palestinians, are futile. The only security for the Palestinians would become security for Israelis.

This why we call upon all nations of the world and governments to endorse the just Palestinian quest for freedom and independence.

The international community and all nations have a historic responsibility towards this conflict and the rights of the Palestinian people. All the nations of the world have long championed the values of peace and human rights. May the nations of the world apply these values to this conflict, which it created years ago, and help reconcile Israelis and Palestinians, security to the Israelis, and independent state, freedom and human dignity to the Palestinians.

from the Holy Land, we call on you to take this principled position to recognise the State of Palestine and to abide by your legal responsibilities towards a nation under occupation, in order to be able to celebrate justice and peace in the land of the Prince of Peace, Jesus Christ.

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Pilgrimage Itinerary, 27th May – 1st June 2018

Day one - Sunday, 27th May

We will depart from Luton airport on our flight to Tel Aviv, arriving early evening. After clearing immigration and customs we will meet our guide and bus and will be taken to our hotel in Galilee for our evening meal and overnight.

Day two - Monday, 28th May

We will begin our first day of pilgrimage on the shore of the lake of Galilee where Jesus shared breakfast with his disciples after his resurrection. After spending some time here we then visit the site of the feeding of the five thousand and the Mount of Beatitudes. We will then visit the town of Capernaum, central to the ministry of Jesus in this area; after which we will enjoy a boat ride across the lake and then stop for lunch at a local Arab restaurant (included in cost). After lunch we will drive to Cana where Jesus performed his first miracle. We then return to our hotel for our evening meal and our overnight accommodation

Day three - Tuesday, 29th May

After breakfast we travel to Nazareth where we visit the Basilica of the Annunciation, built over the traditional site of the house of Mary. We will then tour Nazareth, visiting the site of Joseph's workshop and the synagogue where Jesus preached. We will call at Mary's well, now in a beautiful orthodox church, and then break for lunch. After lunch we will travel to Mount Tabor, the traditional site of the transfiguration; after a taxi ride to the top of the mountain we will visit the church and enjoy the spectacular views. We return to our hotel for our evening meal and overnight accommodation.

Day four - Wednesday, 30th May

After breakfast we will drive along the Jordan Valley towards Jericho, on route we will call at the Baptismal Site where tradition has it that Jesus was baptised by John. Here we can reach the water's edge and renew our own baptismal vows. We continue to the city of Jericho where we visit the church of the Good Shepherd and then have a tour of the city along with the opportunity to see the mountain where Jesus spent his fast of 40 days and nights. After our tour we will stop for lunch and shopping. After lunch we will leave for the Dead Sea where the brave can enjoy a swim and the faint-hearted can enjoy an ice cream! Then we will travel to our hotel in Bethlehem for our evening meal and overnight accommodation.

Day five - Thursday, 31st May

After breakfast the coach will take us for a full day walking tour of Jerusalem. We will visit the Mount of Olives, starting at the church of the Our Father and then re-tracing the steps of Jesus on the first Palm Sunday we will walk down to the church of Dominus Flevit (the Lord wept) where we can enjoy the panoramic view over the Old City. Then we will walk to the Garden of Gethsemane and the Church of All Nations. After lunch we will visit the church of St Peter built over the site of Caiaphas' House, continue to Mount Zion, seeing the Upper Room, the tomb of King David and the site of the Dormition of Our Lady. We conclude our day by walking the way of the Cross to the Church of the Holy Sepulchre. We will tour the church and then walk through the souk to Jaffa gate. The coach will take us back to Bethlehem for packing and in the evening we will have a farewell meal in a local Bedouin restaurant.

Day six - Friday, 1st June

After breakfast we visit the Church of the Nativity where we will have a guided tour of this, the oldest church in the world. We then visit the Shepherd's fields and here there will be the opportunity to visit a local co-operative souvenir shop; nearly 70 families make and sell their work here. We break for lunch after which we set off for the airport and our return flight to the UK.

Price: £1,470 per person sharing a twin/double room on a half-board basis. Single rooms are available at a supplement of £180. Price includes return airfare including hold baggage, accommodation in 3* hotels on a half-board basis, all transport whilst in the Holy Land, services of a professional guide all entrance fees and gratuities. Please note that this itinerary is not suitable for the less able traveller. Price does not include lunches, drinks or items of a personal nature.
