THE LORD HAS RISEN INDEED!

We rejoice, the Lord has Risen indeed! We see, the women reporting, 'they have taken, the Lord and we don't know where they have put him' Peter and John when they get to the Tomb its Peter who goes straight in both he and John believe and understand.

I believe and I say and so do all of us, the Lord has Risen! If he has Risen, we might ask, Why is there so much corruption, illness and suffering around us and the rich getting richer whiles round the corner there is such abject poverty, human trafficking, slavery and so much hatred.

Recently when I was at the supermarket I was approached by a gentleman who told what was happening to his son and asked me why has the God of love done this to us? I replied there is no easy answer but when you are in your private room take the cross and speak to the Lord as though he was your best friend and tell him how you feel. For the cross goes before us and faith came down from it. And we together with the entire Church say, 'the Lord has Risen indeed.' Even though the resurrection is beautiful decking our Churches with flowers it's more than this. The answer lies in the mystery of the stone rolled away which is the foundation of our existence. The Lord has Risen. This then is what it means.

We are so used to throw away once used or we try to keep up with the Joneses and we buy only never to use them and eventually discard them and we waste so much, the Stone-Lord the source of life is rolled away. You and I, faith in the Risen Lord we look ahead to see there are no barriers, no walls and to see the horizon, there is life, there is joy, there is the cross. How easy it is for you and me to close within ourselves when we encounter difficulties and insurmountable problems we cannot see the wood for the trees and we blame everyone, including God. We require meaning and we find it in that stone rolled away for sin couldn't keep the

tomb closed and the rolled away stone is not discarded it carries with it a meaning which is simply this: 'The Lord has Risen indeed'.

You and I need to think for a moment. Let's examine our problems, the suffering of a loved one or the illness we have been through; look around us to see wars, human tragedies, the abuses, crimes with all of this and more, with a simplicity of heart let us say, 'Lord I don't know how this works, but I know that and I am certain the 'lord has Risen indeed' So, dear friends let us daily repeat in our hearts, the 'Lord has Risen indeed'
