THE MAN'S NEED FOR THANKSGIVING.

Our Lord during his time here on earth enjoyed our joys in his humanity. One could say that he appreciated every aspect of humanity's joys. It encapsulated those simple joys which we at times take for granted. His interior life didn't blunt his attitude nor his sensitivity.

He admired creation since the very dawn of creation. He eulogized the sower going into his field to sow or the man who found a treasure, the joy of the shepherd who found his lost sheep, and woman who found her lost coin. The joy of the father at the return of his prodigal son, the joy of a marriage celebration, and the joy of any woman who brings a child into the world.

For our Lord, such joys are very much real for they symbolize the spiritual joys of the kingdom. It's a joy shared by those who enter the kingdom and are welcomed by the Father. We see this in our Lord's satisfaction in meeting with children who wish to approach him or the rich young man who is faithful but wants to do more, Martha, Mary and Lazarus his friends who open their home to him. But most important of all his joy in seen the Word of God accepted, those possessed by devils, the woman caught in adultery, and Zacchaeus were all converted. The Lord eulogizes about the kingdom been revealed to mere children and is kept from the learned and the clever.

Since our Lord was like us in all things but sin he experienced efficacious spiritual joys, and he saw them as gifts from God. He didn't sit on his laurels until he had fulfilled the mission to bring the good news to the poor and to those in desolation joy. In all his miracles and his forgiveness were signs of divine goodness: They all rejoiced at the marvels he was accomplishing in his ministry and they in turn joyfully gave glory to God. For us Christians, it's a question of living in thanks to the Father as it was for Christ, the joys of the human being which the Father had given him.

With the painting Jesus gives himself to us as the King of Mercy. He himself revealed the Chaplet of the DIVINE MERCY to Sister Faustina and asked her to pray the Chaplet unceasingly. **"Say unceasingly the chaplet that I have taught you. Whoever will recite it will receive great mercy at the hour of death. Priests will recommend it to sinners as their last hope of salvation. Even if there were a sinner most hardened, if he were to recite this chaplet only once, he would receive grace from My infinite mercy. I desire that the whole world know My infinite mercy. I desire to grant unimaginable graces to those souls who trust in My mercy."** (Diary 687)

"Speak to the world about My mercy; let all mankind recognize My unfathomable mercy. It is a sign for the end times; after it will come the day of justice. While there is still time, let them have recourse to the fount of My mercy; let them profit from the Blood and Water which gushed forth for them."

"... My daughter, encourage souls to say the chaplet which I have given to you. It pleases Me to grant everything they ask of Me by saying the chaplet. When hardened sinners say it, I will fill their souls with peace, and the hour of their death will be a happy one. Write that when they say this chaplet in the presence of the dying, I will stand between My Father and the dying person, not as the just Judge but as the merciful Savior." (Diary 1541)

Scripture from Scratch: Why do we need the Old Testament? Marcion, a heretical 2nd century bishop, suggested that Christians should dispense with the Old Testament, that it was rendered void by the New. Some people today might agree. The Church, however, vigorously refutes this idea. The Church has always venerated the Old Testament. Vatican II affirmed this and this is reflected in our Lectionary.

The Old Testament is the true Word of God. It was given (and belongs) to the community of Ancient Israel. We share with our Jewish brothers and sisters our efforts to understand it. "We read it in communities that stand in the Presence of God in the deeply troubling challenges of our own time" (W. Brueggemann).

This course will offer insights into understanding and living these complex writings. Participants may attend individual sessions.

8th November—God of the Hebrew Scriptures: the unknown? God seen through the eyes of an ancient people. God involved in human life. The God of the Psalms.
