In the Gospel, Jesus emphasises the need to welcome strangers and neighbours which has been a strong belief in many cultures. The Indian writer, Tagore reminds us when people left his hut, he found 'God's footsteps on the floor'. The divine lives in each one of us, and when we welcome each other, we welcome God, and Jesus His Son. This is the welcome of the church to all. All too often the church has been choosy about who to welcome or not to the table of the Lord or even to the community. Summoned to the Praise of His Glory

If you only knew what God is offering, Christ said one evening to the Samaritan woman (Jn 4: 10). But what is this gift of God if not himself? And the beloved disciple tells us; He came to his own domain and his own people did not accept him (Jn 1: 11). Saint John the Baptist could still say to many souls these words of reproach There [he] stands among you-'in you'- unknown to you (Jn 1:26).

We were claimed as God's own, *chosen from the beginning, under the predetermined plan of the one who guides all things as he decides by his own will; chosen to be, for his greater glory.* It is Saint Paul who tells us this, Saint Paul who was instructed by God himself. How do we realise this great dream of the Heart of our God, this immutable will for our souls? In a word, how do we correspond to our vocation and become perfect 'Praises of Glory of the Holy Trinity'?

In heaven, each soul is a praise of glory of the Father, the Word, and the Holy Spirit, for each soul is established in pure love and lives no longer its own life, but the life of God. Then it knows him, Saint Paul says, as it is known by him (Cor 13: 12). In other words, its intellect is the intellect of God, its will the will of God, its love the very love of God. In reality, it is the Spirit of love and of strength who transforms the soul, for to him it has been given to supply what is lacking to the soul, as Saint Paul says again. He works in it this glorious transformation.

Saint John of the Cross affirms that 'the soul surrendered to love, through the strength of the Holy Spirit, is not far from being raised to the degree of which we have just spoken', even here below! This what I call a perfect praise of glory!

Catholic view on abortion

The Catholic Church states that abortion is **always wrong** because life begins at conception and is God-given.

This means that in the eyes of the Catholic Church abortion is classed as **murder** and goes against the commandment, Thou shalt not kill (Exodus 20:13). This commandment is reiterated by Jesus in Matthew 19:18.

The Church also disagrees with abortion as it goes against natural law, which is an act that goes against what nature intended. The Church takes an **absolutist** stance on this and believes that abortion is wrong in all situations.

The Catholic Church is pro-life. They argue that all life starts out in the same way, so all life should have the chance to develop and survive.

The Catholic Church argues that all life has value, and that to take life away is a sin. The Catholic Church would argue on behalf of the unborn child that it should be cared for and looked after.

From the first moment of his (her) existence, a human being must be recognised as having the rights of a person - among which is the inviolable right of every innocent being to life. *Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) 2270*

Even though the Catholic Church opposes abortion in each and every instance, if a woman has lifesaving treatment whilst pregnant and a side effect is the ending of a pregnancy, the Church accepts this. This is known as the law of 'double effect.' This does not include having an abortion to save the life of the mother. It is only a non-direct treatment.

TECH US SILENCE OF HEART

MEDETATION; Today, I was talking with the Lord, and He said to me, There are souls with whom I can do nothing. They are souls that are continuously observing others, but know nothing of what is going on within their own selves. They talk about others continually, even during times of grand silence, which is reserved for speaking only with Me. Poor souls, they do not hear My words; their remains empty. They do not not look for Me within their own hearts, but in idle talk, where I am never to be found. (Diary, 1717)

Second Collection: This for specific Donation as announced (i.e., Apostleship of the Sea during this weekend)


Mass Stipends: Making a Mass offering for an intention, or for Deceased Relative, etc.
