Meaning 'journeying together'

We begin with our own situation, with our own experience, especially this last year and a half which has surfaced both strengths and weaknesses in our life as the Church.

Some questions we can explore are these:

1. During this terrible pandemic what strengths did I find my faith and faith community?
2. How, during this time, was I disappointed and sorrowful?
3. In what ways did the grace of God most clearly touch and uplift me?
4. Whom did we neglect the most?
5. Who feels left out?
6. What could we do better?

How do we choose priorities for our own mission?

'The purpose of the Synod is not to produce more documents. Rather, it is intended to inspire people to dream about the church we are called to be, to make hopes flourish, to stimulate trust, to bind up wounds, to weave new and deeper relationships, to learn from one another, to build bridges, to enlighten minds, warm hearts and restore strength to our hands for our common mission' (Vademecum 1.3)

### . TEACHING ON FEELINGS

Meditation: During Holy Mass, I saw Jesus stretching out on the Cross, and He said to me, **My pupil, have great love for those who cause you suffering. Do good to those who hate you.** I answered, "O my Master, You see very well that I feel no love for them, and that troubles me." Jesus answered, **It is not always within your power to control your feelings. You will recognize that you have love if, after having experienced annoyance and contradiction, you do not lose your peace, but pray for those who have made you suffer and wish them well.** (*Diary*, 1628).

#### My Prayer Response:

Thank You, Jesus, for teaching me about my feelings when annoyed by people. Help me to love them and remain in peace. Whenever I think of them, remind me to pray for them.
