## The Cry of Advent

Holy Church cries out to Jesus, desiring that we join her in repeating the word proper to Advent—the plea of the exile—‘Come!’ in heaven our song will express possession, felicity; from our lips and from our heart will break forth the ‘new canticle’ of holy Scripture. But in our banishment, although once in a while that heavenly chant flashes like lightning at midnight, ordinarily we can intone only the word of hope and desire: ‘Come! Come!’

This the word of exile. Let us not tire of repeating it. If we lie in darkness and in shadows of death, let us cry out to him. ‘Come!’ And he will come with his grace to purify us and to lift us up. If we sit in sadness and dejection, let us continue pleading: ‘Come! Come!’ And he will come with his presence to scatter our sadness and with his help to strengthen our weakness. May the constant cry of hope and of desire never fail to rise from our heart; then each coming of Jesus will purify us, give us life, and make us happy by inflaming us with love.

Here on earth love has the strange prerogative of producing emptiness in our hearts the more it fills them; of producing a thirst the more it refreshes us; for each degree of love that our soul receives is a new degree of hope and of desire blossoming from depth of our being. Hence, the more we love the more we repeat the word of exile, ‘Come!’ Even when arrived at the peak of perfection, from that height we continue pleading, and with greater vehemence we utter the same word; ‘Come!’

Is it not this same word that forms the theme, so to speak, of the blessed symphony of this world while awaiting the consummation of time? At the end of Revelation, Saint John paints with two masterly strokes—two phrases—the history of the world since Jesus came twenty centuries ago until he will return to judge the living and the dead at the end of time: *The Spirit and the Bride say, ‘Come’*. *Let everyone who listens answer, ‘Come’*. Come Lord Jesus.

### 'Synodal process'

Meaning 'journeying together'

We begin with our own situation, with our own experience, especially this last year and a half which has surfaced both strengths and weaknesses in our life as the Church.

Some questions we can explore are these:

1. During this terrible pandemic what strengths did I find my faith and faith community?
2. How, during this time, was I disappointed and sorrowful?
3. In what ways did the grace of God most clearly touch and uplift me?
4. Whom did we neglect the most?
5. Who feels left out?
6. What could we do better?

How do we choose priorities for our own mission?

'The purpose of the Synod is not to produce more documents. Rather, it is intended to inspire people to dream about the church we are called to be, to make hopes flourish, to stimulate trust, to bind up wounds, to weave new and deeper relationships, to learn from one another, to build bridges, to enlighten minds, warm hearts and restore strength to our hands for our common mission' (Vademecum 1.3)

On 30th November there is an Area Meeting headed by Bishop Nicholas Hudson at St Mary and St Michael, 2 Larkin St, E10AA at 7pm where the discussion would centre on our Journey together. "Dear brothers and sisters, the Lord is not so much looking for skilled Scripture commentators, as He is looking for docile hearts which, welcoming His Word, allow themselves to be changed inside. My heart is reduced to dust and ashes, and even if all people were to trample me under their feet, I would still consider that a favor (*Diary*, 1559).

Thank You, Lord Jesus, for the graces and mercy You have lavished on me. Without them, *I am nothing*, but with them and only with them, I am a participant of eternal life. May I live in this true knowledge of myself.
