On the road to Bethlehem

Each time I am in the Holy Land and in particular Bethlehem. I wonder what the journey might have been for our Blessed Mother and St Joseph. Traveling along the dusty roads, on a donkey gently guided by Joseph protecting our Blessed Mother with child. Navigating, through the pandemonium of highways and byways packed with people pushing to reach the destination to comply with Roman power and domination.

For Joseph and Mary, this call to go to Bethlehem to register is a sign from God, and it confirms that the child to be born is the shepherd king and saviour of his people. It fulfils the promise that the Anointed One would be born in Joseph's hometown of Bethlehem.

Before dawn, they set out, Mary on a donkey, Joseph leading the way keen on a good start before darkness. Mary heavily pregnant almost reaching the end of her term, is sensitive to jolts, twists, and turns. It's a perilous journey to take with wild beasts, desert wastes with pirates that prey on the vulnerable. There is Joseph gently guiding and keeping ever closer with Mary to protect and provide to fulfil his mission.

What joy that greets them as they see in the distance the Holy City. A very last effort to reach the City of David. and to find lodgings before nightfall. Mary cries that her contractions have begun, the pain is excruciating, no one has any room, but a kind soul who sees Mary's condition takes pity and points to a cave where animals shelter but it's smelly, and yet it's dry warm, and free. This is not what Joseph envisaged but it's better than nothing. For Mary, it's holy ground where she could lie down to prepare.

As night falls and people settle down, wrapped in their own petty complaints. They are completely oblivious to heaven coming to bless the earth, as the water breaks Mary about to give birth. it's agony and ecstasy, with humanity and divinity joined together as one.
