The Beatitudes

Jesus is giving us the Beatitudes from Luke! Telling us how to turn negatives (poverty, hunger, hatred) into opportunities to show the love God has for those who suffer and feel left behind. This message of love is for all of us and it's a call to help others. We need to understand that there is a variety of poverty, hunger, and hatred.

What can we do today to share God's love with those who really need it? Could we identify a hunger that someone is suffering from, which could be a hunger due to isolation or loneliness? Could we help someone who may be suffering from spiritual hunger, by using the gifts that God has given us?

Jesus is telling us that Father's endless love is poured out first to the neediest-the marginalised, the despised, the refugee, the asylum seekers the homeless, those in poor housing, the families struggling to make ends meet, those with disabilities, and those who keep falling through the cracks. Then he looks at us and tells us, 'I want you to be like my Father in the way you love, in our place, and in our time. Love the neediest!

This weekend is the International Day for the sick. We pray for them and learn from them. Remember one saint who was bed-ridden for nearly 38 yrs, 'We are all dupes. We seek happiness and find sorrow. We offer ourselves for suffering and find joy' (St Marthe Rubin) Jesus seems to be saying happy the unhappy, What must he mean? Blessed means the condition of being righteous before God, of living as one should before God. The poor are not only those who are economically poor but include those who have been marginalised in any way in society. They are blessed because God is on their side as opposed to the 'rich' who often hold them in contempt and oppress them. Jesus is appealing for love and respect for all those who are outside one's social milieu.

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Sharing in the Blessedness of Christ

Holiness demands a constant effort, but it is possible for everyone because, rather than a human effort, it is first and foremost a gift of God, thrice holy. The Apostle John remarks: 'Think of the love that the Father has lavished on us, by letting us be called God's children; and that is what we are'. It is God, therefore, who loved us first and made us his adoptive sons in Jesus. Everything in our lives is a gift of his love: how can we be indifferent before such a great mystery? How can we not respond to the heavenly Father's love by living as grateful children? In Christ, he gave us the gift of his entire self and calls us to a personal and profound relationship with him. Consequently, the more we imitate Jesus and remain united to him the more we enter into the mystery of his divine holiness. We discover that he loves us infinitely, and this prompts us in turn to love our brethren. Loving, always entails an act of self-denial, 'losing ourselves,' and it is precisely this that makes us happy....,

In truth, the blessed *par excellence* is only Jesus. He is, in fact, the true poor in spirit, the one afflicted, the meek one, the one hungering and thirsting for justice, the merciful, the pure of heart, the peacemaker. He is the one persecuted for the sake of Justice. The Beatitudes shows us the spiritual features of Jesus and thus express his mystery, the mystery of his death and Resurrection. This mystery, which is the mystery of true blessedness, invites us to follow Jesus and thus walk towards it. To the extent that we accept his proposal and set out to follow himeach one in his own circumstances-we too can participate in his blessedness. With him, the impossible becomes possible and even a camel can pass through the eye of a needle; with his help, can we become perfect as the heavenly Father is perfect.

"Why do good to people who are not willing to accept you? It is a question that we too often ask ourselves. But it is a question that helps us understand God better. Faced with our closures, he does not withdraw: he does not put brakes on his love. Faced with our closures, he goes forward.
