'Love your enemies'

I have often said the Lord's prayer umpteen times and when I come to the words 'and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us' I have found each time I am calm within. Then something happens it might be my fault, or perhaps I've had an argument. I find that I am very bitter and full of revenge, and now I have an enemy.

At first, I say he/she will recognise their mistake and would come around, just you wait and see. But sadly it's one of those cases where they would not come around. After some time I might say, this is ridiculous, and try to make contact by phone or in these times via email, to get things sorted out. But it's the opposite of what I intended and they do not want to have things as they were, in fact, they are quite fed up with me. Not long afterward, I find they have spoken behind my back on numerous occasions, and I realise I have an enemy.

Soon, after having discovered this reality, I am reminded of those words in Scripture, 'You have learnt it said: You must love your neighbour and hate your enemy. But I say to you; love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you' I find a new period in my life begins, I try to love my enemies-but how? There have been difficult loves in my life and I find I am applying it to my situation. How I loved my parents or those friends in college in my early years. I now love the parish that I am ministering to: the parishioners. I find the various shades of love there is that move the human heart during one's life. Now, I am reminded once again of that command to love my enemies, which is a new love in my life, and it's a discovery through a slow process- it's completely different from all other loves I have known, and it's anxious and unemotional. I discover it is in my will, but I hope that in the eyes of God it is a fire which, in his own good pleasure will melt the resistance that is within me, and our Lord's wish will be accomplished: 'That they may be one....may they be completely one




