## 33 SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

#### The battel between good and evil

We know the outcome, Jesus won during his Passion, Death, and Resurrection. The battle continues to be played out until the end of time. It's good for us that we know who the victor is: Jesus. All evil be conquered if for a little while it looks as though it's winning or will win. But Scripture assures us that even if we have to endure persecution as a result of our faith, in the end we will be vindicated. For those who are persecuted for their faith, the vindication might be in the next life. Whether the persecution be long or short, the important thing to remember is that Jesus will win, all evil be conquered, and no matter what happens we have every reason to hope and believe in Jesus' victory.

In our Gospel, from Luke, we see hope beyond persecution as He tells the disciples about the persecution of his followers would take place before the temple in Jerusalem would be destroyed by the Romans in AD 70. Even today we can see the stones cast down Jesus said they would be. He told the disciples that they would be seized, persecuted, put in prison, and some of them would be put to death. But he assured them, 'Your endurance will win you your lives'

Our Christian brothers and sisters in the Middle East have suffered for there faith and many have paid with their lives. I recall one priest whom I met in exile in Jordan, who had to flee with some of his parishioners, he told me how sad he was to leave his parents and brother and sister behind. One day in the middle of the night the doorbell rang, he opened the door to his amazement it was his parents and family. They had walked all the way from Mosul. Not only in the Middle East but also in other parts of the world Christians are suffering for their faith, 'Your endurance will win you your lives'

In the land of the free (USA), there is misunderstanding about the Catholic faith and discrimination exits; just recently an 'evangelical pasture' burnt bibles and rosaries, Catholic Bishops and priests have to stand up for the freedom of religion and the freedom to believe the creed and not to be forced to act against our conscience. In some cases in the world some doctors have had to forego their career not to be forced to act contrary to their Catholic faith or who paid the price for remaining faithful. 'That will be your opportunity to bear witness'.


# St Edmund of Abingdon-Bishop Patron Saint of our Church We specially remember Him on 16th November and ask Him to pray for us.


Edmund Rich was born in 1180 in Abingdon, Oxfordshire. He studied the then new Universities of Oxford and Paris. He returned to Oxford in 1214 and became Professor of Philosophy. He was a pioneer of Scholasticism and in addition a significant biblical scholar St Edmund Hall, Oxford, is named after him.

In 1233, after some 11 years as Treasurer at Salisbury, he was appointed Archbishop of Canterbury. He undertook a considerable programme of reform during his time as Archbishop, asserting the authority of the bishop within the Church and the independence of the Church from the state.

His work aroused opposition, not least from the King. It was while on a journey to Rome on appeal against the King that Edmund died, at Soissy on November 16th, 1240.

He was buried at Pontigny, and was canonised, only 6 years later, in 1246.







#### Dear Friends.

As we approach, Christmas and planning how to celebrate with your family and friends.

Could I suggest you consider those in need. Today, how many people are without food on their table or having to rely on food banks. Friends, I ask you to think about it this Christmas, it's the Christmas of the Crib. Visit the Crib as you do think about the people who having to go without. Ask yourself, how can I help those in need? Get in touch with various organisations that reaches out to families and children this Christmas and how you could support them.

Try to keep your Crib simple, don't commercialise it as we see in shopping centres. Instead, recall how Jesus was born in a stable the Holy Family had nowhere to go, and he came to live amongst the people to experience their suffering. He knew what it meant to be hungry and the pain of hunger. He showed his unlimited love, and sacrificed his life on the cross

The more I reflect, I conclude that Jesus didn't want his birth to be celebrated the way we are doing today, as It's full of commercialisation which has reduced the true meaning of Christmas. But we Catholic's wouldn't want his birth celebrated in this manner Hence I ask you to reflect on the birth of Jesus and cut out the wasteful decorations and use that money if you can to help the needy and may your giving be done in the name of Jesus, and perhaps buy food for a family who might be struggling this Christmas. So, they might have some joy, and may this Christmas be truly meaningful for all of us, as we prepare through Advent by listen to the readings. Thank you,

#### **SCHOOL APPLICATIONS**

We are approaching that time of the year when parents request a priest's reference. Usually, it's the Catholic Practice form. Catholic Practice means regular attendance at Mass. It is a requirement that all Catholics attend Mass on Sundays and on holidays of obligation. While there may be genuine reasons for the occasional absences from Mass. It has been made clear that fortnightly or monthly attendance does not constitute the practice required by Church Law.

Since I've been here I have urged parents to come and see me to establish two things:

Any problems they might have in meeting the requirement to attend Mass every week and How we might establish proof as to what their attendance has been.

Most parents, don't think of the lead times that are involved. If you want your child to enter a new school in September 2022, the applications have to be in, depending on the school, somewhere between March and October 2021. Don't wait until then to speak to me about your problems or to discuss how to get evidence to support your request for weekly Mass attendance. You need to come to me a year prior to that.

Recently a problem has emerged: where families who, because of their situation, think they will not need a reference and so take no action to establish a basis; then circumstances change-they want to change school, and now they find themselves exposed, unable to get a reference that they need. It does not cost you to put a basis for a reference in place: please be prudent. Thank you,
