2 SUNDAY OF ADVENT

'Repent for the kingdom of heaven is close at hand'

Our deepest earing is for peace among all people. We desire an end to war and strife, misunderstanding. Then what we see on TV doesn't help as it focuses on violence, and young people stab with knives and the brokenness of the human nature doesn't uplift us, instead it poisons the mind with negativity. The sin of Adam has affected the lives of all of us in various ways. The brokenness in our own lives and in the lives of others. This brokenness in our own lives affects ourselves as don't choose what is right or good, and it affects those with whom we come into contact since none of us has that intended image of God, and it affects our relationship with God by distracting us from putting God first. We have a deep yearning for peace, healing and harmony. We are familiar with the spirit of Advent because we have an Advent longing for God in our lives to restore everything to the way it was meant to be.

In our reading from Isaiah we see this return to harmony among the animals:

The wolf lives with the lamb

the panther lies down with the kid, calf and lion cub feed together

with a little boy to lead them

The cow and the bear make friends,

their young lies down together....., They do no hurt, no harm, on all my holy mountain.

Last week heard from Isaiah in that beautiful prophecy, when we heard, these will hammer their swords into ploughshares, their spears into sickles. Nation will not lift sword against nation, there will be no more training for war. Today we re told, for the country is filled with knowledge of the Lord as the waters swell the sea.

Jesus is the one who will make this peace and harmony possible and heal all brokenness when the whole world will turn to him.

Jesus is this sign that has been set up for the entire world. He lives in the Church now and we are Gentiles, our first reading is fulfilled in our lives since we have found Jesus, That day, the root of Jesse shall stand as a signal to the peoples. It will be sought out by the nations and its home will be glorious, the Church.

The peace promised in Jesus and for which we long for must begin in our own hearts, and we have to work for it, we cannot leave it to God. Peace occurs when we make decisions that lead to peace. Even though we have found Jesus in his glorious dwelling, the Church, because of the sin of Adam and the brokenness we all share, we have a spiritual progress to make in our lives Thus the words of John the Baptist in our Gospel are words we want to make our own; "But if you are repentant, produce the appropriate fruit, and do not presume to tell yourselves, We have Abraham for our father, because, I tell you, God can raise children for Abraham from these stones".

Producing good fruit through repentance, we will be bringing peace to ourselves, to others, and healing our relationship with God. Lets pray this Advent that we will receive the grace from God to produce the good fruit of repentance and bring peace. If we don't, there is a warning from John the Baptist in the Gospel when he describes Jesus cleansing humanity by separating good from evil. His winnowing-fan is in his hand; he will clear his threshing-floor and gather his wheat into the barn; but the chaff he will burn in a fire that will never go out.

St Paul writing to the Romans, reminds us, And may he who helps us when we refuse to give up, help you all to be tolerant with each other, following the example of Christ Jesus, so that united in mind and voice you may give glory to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ.

A rousing of the mind to the contemplation of God

Come now, insignificant man, fly for a moment form your affairs, escape for a little while from the tumult of your thoughts. Put aside now your weighty cares and leave your welcome toils. Abandon yourself for a little to God and rest for a little in him.

Enter into the inner chamber of your soul, shut out everything save God and what can be of help in your quest for him and having locked the door seek him out. Speak now, my whole heart, speak now to God: 'I seek your countenance, O Lord, your countenance I seek'

Come then, Lord my God, teach my heart where and how to seek you, where and how to find you.

Lord, if you are not present here, where, since you are absent, shall I look for you? On the other hand, if you are everywhere why then, since you are present, do I not see you? Again, by what signs, under what aspect, shall I seek you? Never have I seen you, Lord my God, I do not know your face.



Lord, you are my God and my Lord, and never have I seen you. You have created me and re-created me and you have given me all the good things I possess, and still I do not know you. In fine, I was made in order to see you, and I have not vet accomplished what I was made for.

And you, O Lord, how long? How long, Lord, will you be unmindful of us? How long will you turn your countenance from us? When will you look upon us and hear us? When will you enlighten our eyes and show your countenance to us? When will you give yourself again to us?

Look upon us, Lord; hear us, enlighten us, show yourself to us. Give yourself to us that it may be well with us, for without you it goes so ill for us. Have pity upon our efforts and our strivings towards you, for we can avail nothing without you.

Teach me to seek you, and reveal yourself to me as I seek, because I can neither seek you if you do not teach me how, nor find you unless you reveal yourself. Let me seek you in desiring you; let me desire you in seeking you; let me find you in loving you; let me love in finding you. St. Anselm
