
When I read the Gospel for the Fourth Sunday of Advent. I marvel at St Joseph' continued adherence to the divine plan, even when the situations are mysterious to him.

In my life and yours too, there is always some mystery, perhaps God is pleased to work in a hidden, secret manner or his actions are incomprehensible to us, because of our poor intelligence. I need to trust and have that trust of faith, that confidence to rely on the goodness of God, to convince myself that he always and in all circumstances wants my good and yours and disposes everything to that end. Only this loving trust of St Joseph, to say my yes to the divine will, a humble yes in spite of the difficulties, the problems the darkness of my heart, the mystery, God made use of the angels to make his will known to Joseph; to manifest it to us he has made use of bishops, priests, catechists, parents, who like the angels are his messengers and envoys. You and I are called to obey like St Joseph, sadly I have failed to be obedient to understanding that God can employ any person or situation to make us know and execute his divine will, just as he used Caesar' edict to bring Joseph to Bethlehem, where the Saviour was born. Caesar had a far different intention, but God utilised this political act to carry out the plan of the Incarnation. This should remind us, that God governs and directs all things towards the fulfilment of his will.

Another characteristic of St. Joseph life was his consecration to the mission entrusted to him by God. Joseph didn't live for himself and his own interests, but for God whom he served in Jesus and Mary. It's no wonder he is referred to as the true model of interior souls, of souls who desire to live totally for God and with God, in fulfilling the mission they have received from him.

Let us pray: O dear St. Joseph, we place ourselves, then with confidence under your protection. Teach us to live as you did, in faith and abandonment to God; teach us to live solely for him, by consecrating ourselves entirely to his service. Amen Fr. Christopher


