## Willing to Be Salt and Light

It is one of the more quiet truths of Catholicism that souls at time freely surrender long-guarded secrets as though this self-revelation is the most natural conversation that can take place. The visiting rooms of cloisters and monasteries have always known this, and priests of course know it in confessionals-people never seen before coming to unburden their darkest truths at a first encounter.

Perhaps it happens because God's eyes are strangely felt in the presence of a monk or priest or nun, and this releases the floodgates of dark reminiscence with no thought of caution, only a desire for purging. Indeed, it may be that the first hour of many conversations, sometimes near the end of lives, coincides with this sense of being already well known upon entering into the presence of a man or woman whom God is mysteriously using to disguise his own openhearted embrace.

After our own experience of conversion, we should trust that there is a kind of vulnerability for God in everyone, a spark in the soul ready to flame up towards God at unexpected moments. Often it takes misfortune, a tragedy, a personal loss, and then the vigilance against God suddenly gives way., The crushing moment has become a divine knock at the soul's door. The suffering has become a merciful gesture. We cannot know this by looking form the outside, but we should always respect its possibility. A personal misfortune may mean salvation for a soul, and we should take care to tread gently, not to get in God's way, and yet to be ready to his instrument.

#### INSIGHT INTO ST EDMUND'S ANNUAL FINANCIAL RETURNES

The annual financial return for the year ended 31 December 2022 of St. Edmund's has been approved on 25 January 2023 by Finance Committee. The parish income increased by 2.4% from prior year with significant movement coming from offertories loose plate and contactless and from specific donations. Total expenditure also increased by 0.5% with significant amount coming from property repairs and renewals. **Year end result is on a deficit position with total expenditure exceeding the total income.** 

The parish was able to contribute to different charities through your generosity – Holy Places, Sick & Retired Priests, Priests Training Fund, CAFOD and Spiritan Fathers, Poor & Needy. There were also a number of installation, repairs and maintenance in 2022 which includes new boiler, installation of wifi extension point and router, maintenance works in and around the church, and drawings of hall extension.

The parish needs to be adequately funded to secure the continuity of its missions for the next generation. With the bills being paid every month for the maintenance of the parish, we rely on your donations.

#### Fr Dominic writes:

As we begin a new calendar year, the mission of Justice and Peace around our Diocese is as urgent as ever. In our parishes, chaplaincies and schools the call to action on behalf of the weakest in society is such a vital part of our Catholic life. Faith put into action is the driving force of our communities.

The cost of living crisis demands us to advocate for change in the way we distribute wealth as the poor are getting poorer, the rough sleeping crisis is reaching unmanageable limits, and the class divide is growing ever wider. The migrants seeking sanctuary here challenge us to be a Church which is truly welcoming. Our communities too are being challenged to promote racial justice as at the heart of the Gospel. **We mark Racial Justice Sunday this coming Sunday, 5th February.** The ecological crisis is spurring on many to make practical changes which help preserve the creation God gave us to steward for future generations. Working alongside Caritas Westminster, as Justice and Peace we are striving in our communities to answer Pope Francis' call to be a Church not just with and for but of the poor, conscious we are all in the same boat as fragile human beings in an increasingly fragile world. Further afield, world peace is threatened in so many other parts of the world and, along with CAFOD, we do all we can to keep those places of conflict and war in our minds and hearts and to advocate on behalf of the weakest. Thankfully, we have an excellent network of Parish and Chaplaincy Contacts and we are seeking more in 2023. We recently welcomed Martin Pendergast from St Joseph's, Bunhill Row, as a new member of the Commission and are very grateful for the hard work and wise, energetic leadership of our Co-ordinator, Colette Joyce.

Every year the Agency for Evangelisation prepares a Lent faith-sharing resource for small groups. This year's booklet - 'Enlarging the Space of our Tent'- aims to ground the work of justice and peace around the Diocese in the context of our faith and the Sunday celebration of Mass, built on attentiveness to the scriptures and to prayerful discernment of priorities in the light of the current Synod process.
