# We have a Wisdom

In St Paul's letter to Corinthians in our Second Reading speaks of the wisdom to offer. A wisdom that has been revealed to us. This wisdom will bring about our glory, a glory that God has predestined for us. We may ask what does he mean?

When we think of wisdom in our daily life we think about a kind of knowledge. It's not just a knowledge of facts, not just a knowledge of many things. One could be knowledgeable in different subjects, but not necessarily be regarded as wise. When we say that someone is wise, we mean that someone has a deeper insight into something, a knowledge into way things really are, an important type of Knowledge.

When St Paul speaks of the wisdom that has been revealed to us, that would bring about our glory, he has this deeper insight in mind. He also has in mind the way wisdom is spoken in the Bible.

The Bible has several books on wisdom: The Proverbs, Job, Ecclesiastes and Ecclesiasticus,, from which we have our First Reading this Sunday. In these books wisdom is depicted as a kind of right order that is to be found in the world as created by God, a right order in nature and a right order in human life. Wisdom is the rule for a successful and happy life that God has revealed to us, revealed in the natural world, revealed to human minds, as they search out how to live and how to live well as God wants us to do.

Wisdom taught in the Bible, a kind of deep insight into the way things are, a deep insight that serves as a rule, a guide, for knowing how to live well, to be successful and to flourish as human beings, to be happy and fulfilled, to live as God wants to live. God wants us to flourish and to be happy as human beings. We can choose to live according to this wisdom or not. As our first reading reminds us:

He has set fire and water before you; put your hand to whichever you prefer. Man has life and death before him; whichever a man likes better will be given him.

For Paul there is even more to the wisdom, and he has in mind the wisdom that is revealed to us in Jesus.

Jesus in the embodiment of God's wisdom. It is Jesus who reveals to us the deep insight into the reality of things, revealing to us the right way to live, the path we should follow if we want to be happy and to flourish. Jesus reveals this wisdom when he gave the Sermon on the Mount which is given to us in the Gospel of Matthew. The Sermon teaches us the path of the perfect Christian life, the way to be fully happy and to flourish, as sons and daughters of God. Yet we know it's challenging. We know it's difficult and how often we fail. But we should take comfort, from the fundamental truth that it's Jesus who, as the embodiment of divine wisdom, is the one who primarily lives out the life of perfection as set out in the Sermon on the Mount. Our Christian calling is to share in what Jesus already is and enables us to be, as he makes his Spirit within us

#### INSIGHT INTO ST EDMUND'S ANNUAL FINANCIAL RETURNES

The annual financial return for the year ended 31 December 2022 of St. Edmund's has been approved on 25 January 2023 by Finance Committee. The parish income increased by 2.4% from prior year with significant movement coming from offertories loose plate and contactless and from specific donations. Total expenditure also increased by 0.5% with significant amount coming from property repairs and renewals. **Year end result is on a deficit position with total expenditure exceeding the total income.** 

The parish was able to contribute to different charities through your generosity – Holy Places, Sick & Retired Priests, Priests Training Fund, CAFOD and Spiritan Fathers, Poor & Needy. There were also a number of installation, repairs and maintenance in 2022 which includes new boiler, installation of wifi extension point and router, maintenance works in and around the church, and drawings of hall extension.

The parish needs to be adequately funded to secure the continuity of its missions for the next generation. With the bills being paid every month for the maintenance of the parish, we rely on your donations.
