'The harvest is rich but the labourers are few'

When I read Matthew 9: 36-10:8 I look at his vineyard. I see the vulnerability and powerlessness of humanity which is not a recent phenomenon marked by global warming, war, disease (Pandemic), famine.

We could be despondent about what we see and read. In our first reading , the Lord reminds Moses of what he has done and indicates that as evidence that God will continue to act for his people.: 'I will count you a kingdom of priests, a consecrated nation'

As baptised Catholics, 'Have their own part to play in the mission of the whole Christian people in the Church and in the world' (CCC 897), the Gospel is often read with reference to prayer for priestly vocations. So ask the Lord of the harvest to send labourers to his harvest. Who are dedicated to the salvation of souls.

'Obeying Christ command'

St John Paul II wrote, 'the Church first of all makes a humble profession of faith: In praying for vocations, conscious of her urgent need of them for her very life and mission, she acknowledges that they are a gift of God and as such, must be asked for by a ceaseless and trusting prayer of petition'. He continued to say Prayer, is the pivot of all pastoral work for vocations' When we pray for these labourers, we do so with confidence that the Lord equips them for their task Recall how Isaiah, who says, that, he is a man of unclean lips, is purified by a burning coal from the altar' 'See now, this has touched your lips, your sin is taken away, your iniquity is purged' (Is 6:7).

Equally, Jeremiah objects that he does not know how to speak and is touched on the mouth by the Lord. 'There I am putting my words into your mouth' (Jr 1:9b). Then we have a prayer attributed to Cardinal Cushing who prayed; 'O Jesus, I pray for your faithful and fervent priests; for your unfaithful and tepid priests; for your priests labouring at home or abroad in distant mission fields; for your tempted priests; for your lonely and desolate priests. O Jesus, keep them all close to your heart'.

Let us consider Good Friday how many of his disciples remained faithful to Jesus? Judas betrayed him, Peter Denied him. Only John stayed with him at the foot of the cross.

Our prayers include gratitude for the shepherds who cleanse us of the leprosy of original sin, raise us from the death of our mortal sins, and freely give us the Eucharist as food. As Cardinal Cushing prayed, we can pray for 'the priest who baptised me; the priests who have absolved me from my sins; the priests at whose Masses I have assisted and who have given me your Body and Blood in Holy Communion.., all the priests to whom I am indebted in any other way'.

O Mother of Jesus Christ, you were with him at the beginning of his life and mission, you stood beside him when he was lifted up from the earth consumed as the one eternal sacrifice, and you had John, your son, near at hand; accept from the beginning those who have been called, protect their growth, in their ministry accompany your sons, O mother of priests. 

The owner of Westferry Printworks has refused since April 2016 to sign the lease to allow construction of a new secondary school + new sports hall + 4 outdoor sports pitches available out of school hours

But we will lose the football pitches and part of Canary Wharf College secondary school when the car park at Crossharbour is demolished for a new 38-storey tower

This petition asks Tower Hamlets Council and Mayor Lutfur Rahman to do a forced purchase of the land so that the Department of Education can build for Canary Wharf College a new school. This will also save the government from having to buy a new site for the school.

The more signatures the better

Local authorities are responsible for the compulsory purchase of land for all schools even though in this case the land would be probably be owned by the Department of Education as they would own the school building

This is also the only way it seems of getting new sports facilities for the fastest-growing place in the UK
