#### Barren or elderly women.

The first reading from 2 Kings re4minds us of the Old Testament where barren and elderly women are not ignored by God.

They give birth to a son a sign of God's plan for his people. The paradigm is of course the birth of Isaac to Abraham and Sarah. Isaac will be the first of the descendants of Abraham who as we know 'as many as the stars of the heavens'-the promise of God's covenant.

We have the stories of the birth of Samuel and Samson which are significant for the rolls each would play in carrying out God's plan for his people, Then in Luke's Gospel we have such a birth to Zechariah and Elizabeth which tells us of the significance of John the Baptist.

The story we have in our first reading has none of the wider significance. I the many miracle stories of Elijah and Elisha cycle in the Second Book of Kings.

However, the phrase 'This time next year you will hold a son in your arms' echoes the promise the Lord makes to Abraham at the oak of Mamre in Genesis. The son of the woman of Shunem has no role in God's plan that we know of, yet his birth is significant a sign of God's favour. Jesus' words in the Gospel 'Any one who welcomes a prophet because he is a prophet will have4 a prophet's reward' this matches the action of the woman towards Elisha.

The first reading matches with the Gospel, and it reminds us to contemplate the importance of receiving those whom the Lord sends bringing his word. In our first reading the woman of Shuman receives a great reward for her action, Jesus promises that such will be God's generosity and favour to those who welcome those he sends, because in receiving those sent by him, it is the Lord himself who is received.

The reward is salvation, and this what Paul is saying his letter in our second reading in his letter to the Romans, its most certainly God's plan for all his people. Amen


