## **Conformed to the Master**

The One so good and so great desires you to embrace4 him and is waiting to embrace you. He inclines towards you the flower of his head, pierced with many thorns, and calls you to receive the kiss of peace, as if saying: See how I was disfigured, transfixed, and beaten in order that I might place you upon my shoulder; my straying sheep, and bring you back to the paradise of heavenly pastures. Do something now yourself: be moved with pity for my wounds; and such as you see me; Set me like a seal on your heart, like a seal on your arm (Sg 8:6); so that, in every motion of your heart, in e4very deed of your hands, you may resemble me who am wearing the seals you behold. In forming you, I conformed myself to the likeness of my divinity; to re-form you, I conformed myself to the likeness of your humanity. You, who did not keep the imprint of my divinity stamped on you when you were made, keep at least the imprint of your own humanity stamped on me when you were re-formed. If you did not stay as I created you, stay at least as I re-created you. If you fail to understand how great were the powers I granted you in creating you, understand at least how great were the miseries I accepted for you in your humanity, in re-creating you, and in re-forming you for joys much greater than those for which I had originally formed you. I became human and visible so that you might see me and so love me, since, unseen and invisible in my divinity. I had not been properly loved. As a price for my incarnation and passion, give me vourself, for whom I became flesh and for whom I suffered. I gave myself to you, now give yourself to me.

O most sweet and good Jesus, Father of all light, from whom proceeds all that is good, everything that is perfect (Jas1: 17)-, look down mercifully upon us who humbly confess you and truly know that we can do nothing without your help. You gave yourself in payment for us; grant that, although we are little worthy of such a price, we may be so completely and fully restored to your favour that, conforming to the image of your passion; we may also be re-formed to the image of your divinity.

## Mary conceived in her soul before she conceived in her body

A royal virgin of the race of David is chosen to bear the holy child, the divine and human son whom she conceived in her soul before she conceived him in her body. And lest she might be afraid when something so unexpected came to pass, not knowing the divine plan, she was shown in her conversation with the angel that what was to be accomplished in her would be the work of the Holy Spirit; she would soon be the Mother of God without loss of virginity. For why should she lack hope because of the utter novelty of such a conception, when it was promised that it would be brought about by power of the Most High? Her trusting faith was confirmed by a miracle already accomplished. Elizabeth was given unhoped for fertility, so that there would be no doubt that he who granted conception to the sterile could grant it also to a virgin.

And therefore the Word of God, God, the Son of God, who in the beginning was with God and through whom all things were made and without whom was not anything made, became man to liberate man from eternal death. Without any diminution of his majesty he stooped to take on our lowliness, so that, remaining what he always was and taking to himself what he was not, he might unite the genuine state of a salve to that state in which he was equal to God the Father. By such a bond did he link both natures that this exaltation might not consume the lesser, nor the taking of humanity lessen the higher.

Each nature, then, retains all that was proper to it, yet comes together in one person. And so lowliness is assumed by majesty, weakness by power, morality by eternity. To pay the debt of our fallen nature, a nature beyond all suffering was united to our suffering nature; and true God and true man are joined into the unity of the Lord. This was so that, as was need for our healing, one and the same mediator between God and men might, through the one nature, die and , through the other, rise again. Rightly then was virgin integrity in no way marred by giving birth to our salvation, for the birth of Truth was the safeguard of chastity. Such a birth, dearly beloved, befitted Christ, the power of God and the wisdom of God, for by it he would be joined to our humanity yet remain far above us in his divinity. Unless he were true God, he could bring us no aid; unless he were true man, he could offer us no example.

The angels therefore exult at the birth of the Lord: they sing; 'Glory to God in high heaven'; they announce, 'Peace on earth for men on whom his favour rests'. For they behold the heavenly Jerusalem being constructed from out of all the peoples on earth. How greatly ought mere men to rejoice at this mysterious undertaking of divine love, when angels on high thrill so much at it! Pope St Leo the Great
