Matthew 13:24-43

In the parable of the wheat and the darnel, our Lord once again portrays himself as the sower of the Word of God, with the devil coming and 'stealing away what was sown in [man's] heart' The Devil is the one who is forever trying to undo the labour that God undertakes for man's benefit. Concerning the weeds show the various ways in which we can lose the gift of his Word that God puts in our hearts. It's the lack of understanding is what allows the Devil to steal it unopposed, since understanding means my making something my own-a part of me that no one can take away.

It also be that the darnel of worldly anxiety and delightful encumbrances choke the tenderness of my infant faith. I so often want to say yes to the Gospel and to worldly success and enjoyment. This sower, this grain, this field, and this growth, all together are the kingdom of heaven. The tree does not stop its growth until its branches fill the entire space defined by the field, because field is the universe, and this tree is nothing less than the one planted by God in Eden at the beginningthe Tree of Life in the midst of the garden. It is this, called forth by God, and not the Tower of Babel, built by man, that gives true access to the life of God and that connects earth and heaven through nature rather than technology. The parable teaches us that heaven and earth are not antithetical but complementary realities, existing together within the same continuum of what God has created.

Heaven, the abode of God and the sanctuary of his mysteries, may be found through our contemplation of God's works and interventions on earth. To suggest that 'heaven' as a dimension to be 'climbed up to' to be explored and exploited with purely rational means, is an act of arrogance that can only lead to disaster. The Kingdom of heaven could be found only if we seek it as the result of God's planting, in the world as a field sown by him. There is something properly speaking miraculous in the realization that so much could have come from so little. Only the power and wisdom of God can reconcile the two poles in our mind. The mustard grain and its world -filling growth, in fact, are an icon of the creation as such, in which God planted a grain of nothingness into a chaotic abyss, and out of this sprang a whole bustling and variegated universe of harmony that God's delighted eyes found to be 'very good and very beautiful' (Gen 1: 31). Amen
